ACC would like to inform you all about our Youth Action Summit that was held on April 30th. We had many students run for governing board positions. Every position has been filled by an OUSD student who cares about empowering and uplifting student voice.

In the Youth Action Summit DTR students led focus groups on topics ranging from bi-annual teacher feedback to safety.
