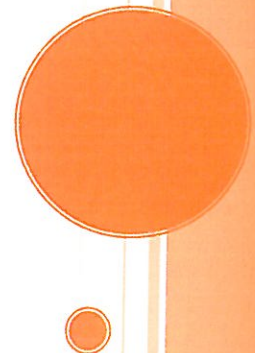

I am writing to express my emphatic support for The Center, both professionally, as an Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) employee, and personally, as an Oakland resident in District 6.

I currently serve as the Farm to School Supervisor for OUSD's Department of Nutrition Services, working closely with Jennifer LeBarre, Executive Director of Nutrition Services and Warehouse. I have worked in the food industry for over a decade and came to OUSD via Boston Public Schools, where I worked in a similar capacity. Over three years ago, I moved cross-country specifically to join the excellent Oakland Unified Nutrition Services team. This combined work experience means I know first-hand the tremendous opportunity The Center is for our department, district, and city. Quite simply, The Center will revolutionize school meals in Oakland and health outcomes for students across the city. As you know, Oakland is nationally recognized for our commitment to improving school meals. While we have certainly made meaningful gains in recent years to serve more local, sustainable, equitable, humane, fresh, and nutritious foods to students, without significantly improving our facilities, in many ways, we are at a stand-still. The Center will eliminate 80% of pre-packaged foods currently served to students, vastly expand freshly prepared seasonal foods on our menus, and enable us to purchase foods directly from California farmers, like ALBA Growers Collective in Watsonville, CA, and Oakland-based businesses, like Community Grains Pasta. Not only will The Center mean better meals for OUSD students and expanded investment in the local economy, it will also mean more jobs and better jobs (highly skilled and full-time) right here in Oakland as we internalize processing of fresh produce and meats and expand our meal service.

Above all, our students deserve The Center. We currently serve almost 40,000 meals every day and over 70% of our students qualify for free or reduced priced lunch under federal guidelines. On paper, these are just numbers. In person, these numbers are children; children who rely on our program every day. For some children, school is the only place they eat, and for many children, school is the only place where fresh fruits and vegetables are offered. There is real hunger here in Oakland. You need only step into a cafeteria on a Monday morning to see the hunger in a child's eyes who has not eaten well, or at all, over the weekend, or observe a lunch and find the child surreptitiously slipping an extra pear or applesauce into her pocket for a hungry sibling at home. In this context, The Center is not only the reasonable choice for our city, it is the right choice. As a district, I believe we have a moral obligation to serve our students the best meals we can.

On a personal level, my wife and I also support The Center. We reside in Maxwell Park, District 6, and pay property taxes to the City of Oakland. I voted for Measure J in 2012 specifically because I supported the central kitchen project then, as I do now. I think it is imperative that the District fulfill its promise to Oakland voters, almost 85% of whom, like me, voted in favor of Measure J. As a voter and a tax-payer, this is an issue of integrity and trust; should the project fall through, I will question supporting future Oakland Unified ballot initiatives.

My wife and I welcomed our daughter, Juliette, to our family in May, 2015. Juliette will one day attend an Oakland Unified school and with this lens, we also support The Center both because it will radically improve school meals for Juliette and because it will serve as an important hub for agricultural and culinary education from which our daughter will benefit. If Juliette was in school in Oakland today and fortunate enough to attend one of our District's 30 schools with cooking kitchens, we would encourage her to eat lunch in the school cafeteria. However, if Juliette, like so many of our students, attended one of our District's 55 Satellite school, where meals are shipped in daily from an existing over-stretched central kitchen, we would not allow Juliette to participate in the school meal program. The current quality of the Satellite meals is simply not what we want for our daughter, nor is it what we want for any child in Oakland. Of course, our family has a choice, unlike so many other families here in Oakland. The Center will raise the bar for everyone, creating an equitable and high-quality meal program of which we can all be proud.
