ELL snapshot

- 1. Clearly indicates for an individual ELL student which reclassification criterion has or has not been met
- 2. Provides a space for all stakeholders to set goals and plan
 - next steps for student, parent, teacher
 - specific interventions to support the ELL student in meeting those goals
- 3. Is in various stages of use across the district, but very helpful when used systematically at sites in parent-teacher-student conferences

Launch an OEA-OUSD joint committee to make recommendations on bilingual staffing












LCAP Measurable Outcomes for 2015-16



- 4.1 Increase the English Learner (EL) reclassification rate by 3 percentage points.
- 4.2 Increase the Long-Term English Learner (LTEL) reclassification rate by 5 percentage points.
- 4.3 Increase the percentage of English Learners who make progress toward English proficiency.


