Upon conferring with our Board's CSBA Assembly delegates – Jody London and Roseann Torres – they recommend that the Board, in the Run-Off election, support the candidacy of Valerie Arkin.

What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it?

- 3. Innovative programs for student engagement and success. Arts integration, magnet schools, CTE centric schools, dual-language immersion, music immersion, etc. More and more, "standardized" curriculum is failing underachieving and underserved students. Specialized, differentiated programs and curriculum not only "revitalize" an under-performing school, they better capture students' attention and engagement.


