FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- ★ Preliminary findings and recommendations were developed at All City Council's winter retreat attended by 20 students from 6 different schools

RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation #1: Goal 2

We recommend a student friendly and accessible credit recovery system for students who fall behind in their coursework, as non-traditional learning opportunities, such as internships and projects.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation #2: Basic Services

We recommend a more efficient maintenance and response system for OUSD facilities, which would speed response times for construction and resource management, as well as maintain cleaner spaces by having clearly visible and accessible trashcans in every room of a school, including bathrooms.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation #3: Goal 5

We recommend a three tier system of organization, from hiring to training, for all school staff and administrators that mandates mock lessons, includes mandatory student feedback component for all staff, and concludes with student lead professional development

RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation #4: Goal 5

We recommend institutionalized school wide opportunities for creating positive school culture that bring students, staff, and administrators together to build healthy relationships through engaging activities and dialogue.
