These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by CONTRACTOR or its Sub-CONTRACTORs in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. All works shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code, and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD.
- 17. Waiver: No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- 18. Termination: OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to OUSD exceeds the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall pay the additional cost.
- 19. Conduct of Consultant. CONSULTANT will adhere to the following staff requirements and provide OUSD with evidence of staff qualifications, consistent with invoicing requirements outlined in Section 8, which include:

The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this Agreement and CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows: "CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the Agreement, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. Contractor further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and Contractor has requested and reviews subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contract with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this Agreement.

- 20. No Rights in Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 21. OUSD's Evaluation of CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR's Employees and/or Subcontractors. OUSD may evaluate the CONTRACTOR's work in any way that OUSD is entitled to do so pursuant to applicable law. The OUSD's evaluation may include, without limitation:
 - Requesting that OUSD employee(s) evaluate the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
 - 2. Announced and unannounced observance of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).

- 22. Limitation of OUSD Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, OUSD's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall OUSD be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of, or in connection with, this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.
- 23. Confidentiality. The CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. CONTRACTOR understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement. Contractors will be permitted access to student data only where permissible under state and federal law and only after executing OUSD's Confidentiality Agreement Regarding Student Data.
- 24. Conflict of Interest. CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any officer or employee of OUSD to perform any service by this Agreement.

CONTRACTOR affirms to the best of his/her/its knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between CONTRACTOR's family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement, and in the event of change in either private interest or services under this Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest which may arise as a result of such change will be brought to OUSD's attention in writing.

Through its execution of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR acknowledges that it is familiar with the provisions of section 1090 et seq. and section 87100 et seq. of the Government Code of the State of California, and certifies that it does not know of any facts which constitute a violation of said provisions. In the event CONTRACTOR receives any information subsequent to execution of this Agreement, which might constitute a violation of said provisions, CONTRACTOR agrees it shall notify OUSD in writing.

- 25. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties.
- 26. Litigation: This Agreement shall be performed in Oakland, California and is governed by the laws of the State of California. The Alameda County Superior Court shall have jurisdiction over any state court litigation initiated to enforce or interpret this Agreement. If litigation is initiated, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- 27. Contract Contingent on Governing Board Approval: The District shall not be bound by the terms of this Agreement until it has been formally approved by the District's Governing Board, and no payment shall be owed or made to CONTRACTOR absent formal approval. This Agreement shall be deemed to be approved when it has been signed by the Board of Education, and/or the Superintendent as its designee.
- 28. Signature Authority: Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
- Counterparts: This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.

The Circle of Care/PALS program has been a program of the East Bay Agency for Children since 1987. The Circle of Care/PALS program is a prevention and intervention program that seeks to help children be successful in school by providing psychotherapy and other prevention and intervention services to the highest-risk population of students on any given OUSD campus served by the program. The two programs Circle of Care/PALS merged several years ago into one program – Circle of Care providing grief Illness and loss support services, and PALS Prevention and Life Skills. We aid youth through the provision of mental health services (psychotherapy) and other counseling services such as milieu counseling on school campuses, and peer support groups at our grief clinic.

We collaborate with OUSD and Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services to provide services on school campuses. Primarily we place a full-time Mental Health Clinician on a school site. The Principal and Teachers work directly with EBAC Circle of Care/PALS Mental Health Clinician in partnership to refer youth most in need of mental health services. Psychotherapy and skill building services are provided over the course of the school year. Assessment, crisis intervention, referral, and case management services are also provided. Since 1996 this program has been funded largely with MedicCal dollars and services are provided to students eligible for MediCal. Some schools continue to provide additional funding for services to non-MediCal eligible students.

We currently have full-time staff placed on the following OUSD school campuses:

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND

EAST BAY AGENCY FOR CHILDREN Circle of Care/PALS Program

This Agreement, entered into on 6/19/2012 by and between the OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, 1025 Second Avenue, Oakland, California 94606, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT, and East Bay Agency for Children, 303 Van Buren Avenue, Oakland, hereinafter referred to as PROVIDER.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT has a vital interest in the mental health of all students and in inviting needed resources into its schools; and

WHEREAS, Roots International School, located at 1390 66th Ave, has identified mental health services as a much needed component of the educational structure of the school; and

WHEREAS, the Early Periodic, Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) Federal Medicaid program currently provides funding for Medical eligible students at no cost to the District; and

WHEREAS, East Bay Agency for Children has been approved by the County of Alameda to provide services under EPSDT, and

WHEREAS, East Bay Agency for Children is licensed to provide mental health and preventative support services to children and families,

NOW, therefore, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SCHOOL SITE/DISTRICT

The District will:

- 1) Secure a confidential workspace with locked file cabinet and phone line for the Provider.
- 2) Allow the Provider to use the following school resources: phones, copier as necessary.
- 3) Assist with program integration at school site, including access to school attendance records, and school activities.
- 4) Assist with coordination of services with other onsite providers
- 5) Agree on coordinating at least one training for teachers and staff.
- 6) Agree to collaborate with Coordination of Services Team (COST), SST Teams, Family Support Teams, school psychologist and principal to provide referrals to provider.
- 7) Provide evidence of Fire Clearance (Central Administration).
- 8) Provide oversight of the program.
- 9) Attempt to mediate any concerns with the assigned EBAC provider(s) and subsequently seek support from EBAC Program Directors as needed.

II RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PROVIDER

The Provider agrees to the following:

- 1) Insure that site staff is culturally and linguistically competent to work with the school's diverse population of students.
- 2) Provide individual and group supervision for clinicians on a weekly basis.
- 3) Adhere to District's Special Education Policies and referral procedures.
- Provide limited pro bono services or manage appropriate referrals for students NOT covered by EPSDT funding.
- Participate in mental health/public health trainings for teachers and school officers offered by the site.
- 6) Develop and maintain a database of students, keep records, and provide aggregate data as requested by the District for program evaluation purposes.
- 7) Collaborate with school administrators, and agree to communicate any concerns that may arise while providing services at sites.
- 8) Have all site staff fingerprinted and medically tested for tuberculosis prior to delivering services.
- 9) Fulltime clinicians will provide services during the school day from 8-4 5 days a week, with some time away for supervision and administrative meetings.
- 10) Provide site based clinician(s) with cell phones and lap top or desk top computers when possible and necessary.
- 11) Provide Quality Assurance and clinical records charting and monitoring consistent with professional and Medi-Cal standards.
- 12) Coordinate with Principals and District Program Managers for School Based Mental Health to provide excellent service and mediate any on site difficulties.

Clinicians from East Bay Agency for Children will provide the following services for students and their families, who are coping with issues or problems which are impeding their academic success or functioning within their family. Clinicians will provide the following types of services to these youth and their families:

- Psychosocial Assessments of referred children
- Individual and Group Counseling for students
- Family Counseling, family case work and home visits
- Participation in COST and collaboration with other mental health providers on school site
- Attendance at SST or family support team meetings when appropriate
- Crisis consultation, response and planning, as needed
- Teacher consultation and in-service training, as requested
- Grief and illness support services
- Referral services and collaboration with other agencies

In addition, East Bay agency for Children will provide supervision, training, administration and materials and supplies to support the work of the clinicians placed at Roots International School.

III COMPENSATION

The PROVIDER will receive compensation for services provided to Medical students from the EPSDT program managed by the County of Alameda.

For services provided to non Medical students the provider will provide limited pro bono services when available and make appropriate referrals. As EPSDT funding is limited to children who are actively qualified for Medi-Cal insurance coverage and have diagnoses that meet medical necessity, individual schools are strongly encouraged to support non-medical children and youth with school site discretionary funds. Roots International school agrees to provide \$____60,000____ in support of these services.

IV INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

PROVIDER is, for all purposes arising from this Agreement, an independent contractor. No officer, agent, or employee of PROVIDER or DISTRICT shall be deemed an officer, agent, or employee of the other party hereto. Neither PROVIDER nor DISTRICT, nor any officer, agent, or employee thereof shall be entitled to any benefits to which employees of the other party hereto are entitled, including, but not limited to overtime, retirement benefits, workers' compensation benefits, and injury leave or other leave benefits.

V INDEMNIFICATION

- A.PROVIDER agrees to defend, indemnify, and save free and harmless the DISTRICT, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all losses, injuries, claims, actions, causes of action, judgment, and liens arisen from, or alleged to have arisen from PROVIDER's performance, or lack thereof, under this Agreement.
- B. DISTRICT agrees to defend, indemnify, and save free and harmless the PROVIDER, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all losses, injuries, claims, actions, causes of action, judgment, and liens arisen from, or alleged to have arisen from DISTRICT's performance, or lack thereof, under this Agreement.

VI AMENDMENT

No changes in the responsibilities of DISTRICT and/or PROVIDER to be performed herein shall become effective until mutually agreed upon by the DISTRICT and PROVIDER in writing. Such changes as are mutually agreed to by the DISTRICT and PROVIDER, which require additional services or a reduction in services to be performed by PROVIDER under the Agreement and an adjustment to the amount to be paid to PROVIDER as provided herein shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Agreement.

VII TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- B. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated upon thirty (30) days' written notice by either party hereto. Said termination shall not be deemed to be a breach of this Agreement and/or tortuous conduct.

Any notice permitted or required under the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by the party giving or serving the same and either in person or delivered by mail, addressed to the party as follows:
