# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between Developmental Studies Center and Oakland Unified School District

The Oakland Unified School District ("OUSD") is partnering with Developmental Studies Center to implement the Caring School Community Initiative in twenty-four elementary schools during the 2012-2013 school year. In order to fully implement the Caring School Community Initiative Developmental Studies Center has agreed to pass through to OUSD a grant in the amount of up to \$153,300 from the S.D. Bechtel Jr. Foundation. The pass through of the funds is subject to the following terms and conditions:

# In accepting the pass-through grant, OUSD agrees to contribute to the Developmental Studies Center partnership by:

- 1. Appointing staff to coordinate the implementation of Caring School Community in twenty-four elementary schools.
- 2. Meeting regularly with Developmental Studies Center to align services and resources to successfully implement the program in OUSD.
- 3. Accounting quarterly to Developmental Studies Center on amount of released funds used for site visits, professional development, and leadership team meetings prior to the next allocation of funds.
- 4. Creating an end of the year report on the Caring School Community Initiative in OUSD for the 2012-2013 school year.

## Developmental Studies Center agrees to support and contribute to the partnership by:

- 1. Providing on-site coaching, and professional development for participating schools.
- 2. Meeting regularly with OUSD leadership and CSC Initiative Coordinator.

## Payment, Disbursement, and Management of Funds:

Pass through up to \$153,300 from the S.D. Bechtel Jr. Foundation grant to OUSD to support the administration of the Caring School Community Initiative in 2012-2013; \$50,000 to support coordination of the Initiative and up to \$103,300 to support teacher leader participation through professional development and substitute release time. This pass through will happen in three payments: an initial payment made in July, 2012 for the amount of \$27,700 for summer and fall stipends and subs; a second payment on December 1, 2012 for the amount of \$50,000 plus \$6,730 for the stipend funds based on OUSD projections of substitutes and stipends from August – December; a third payment based on projected release funds for professional

development from January – March made by January 15, 2013; a final payment based on actual expenses from April – June made by July 15, 2013.
