Notice shall be effective when received if personally served or, if mailed, three days after mailing. Either party must give written notice of a change of address. CONTRACTOR shall submit invoices in a form that includes the name of the person providing the service, the service performed, the date service was rendered, and the hours spent on the work.

8. Invoicing

 - ii. Tuberculosis Screening: The list must also include a statement that TB Clearance is on file for each person.
- Status of Contractor: This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

10. Insurance:

- 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance: Unless specifically waived by OUSD, the following insurance is required:
 - i. If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and Federal laws when applicable. Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

Nothing in said policy shall operate to increase the Insurer's liability as set forth in the policy beyond the amount or amounts shown or to which the Insurer would have been liable if only one interest were named as an insured.
- iii. If CONTRACTOR is offering OUSD professional advice under this Contract, CONTRACTOR shall maintain Errors and Omissions insurance or Professional Liability insurance with coverage limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim.

- iv. CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain any insurance under this agreement. (Completed and approved Waiver of Insurance Form is required.) Waiver of insurance does not release CONTRACTOR from responsibility for any claim or demand.
- 11. Licenses and Permits: CONTRACTOR shall obtain and keep in force all licenses, permits, and certificates necessary for the performance of this Agreement.

- 13. **Anti-Discrimination**. CONTRACTOR also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its elective board, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, contractor, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to CONTRACTOR in connection with the performance of this Agreement. This provision survives termination of this Agreement.
- 16. Copyright/Trademark/Patent/Ownership. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of OUSD and cannot be used without OUSD's express written permission. OUSD shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark, and/or patent of said matter in the name of OUSD. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium. These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by CONTRACTOR or its Sub-CONTRACTORs in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. All works shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code, and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD.
- 17. **Waiver:** No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- 18. **Termination:** OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to OUSD exceeds the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall pay the additional cost.
- 19. **Conduct of Consultant.** CONSULTANT will adhere to the following staff requirements and provide OUSD with evidence of staff qualifications, consistent with invoicing requirements outlined in Section 8, which include:
 - 1. Tuberculosis Screening
 - 2. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this Agreement and CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows: "CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the Agreement, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. New Teacher Center

When we focus on teachers, our students succeed

New Teacher Center (NTC) improves student learning by accelerating the effectiveness of new teachers and school leaders. By offering extensive and targeted support to new teachers via carefully crafted programs of training and mentoring (both one-on-one and online), NTC works to improve the overall effectiveness of the teaching profession, and to retain and sustain great teachers, especially in the country's hardest-to-serve schools where more than 50% of new teachers leave the profession within three years.

Research, including a two-year randomized control study funded by the US Department of Education, has shown that an intensive training and mentoring ("induction") model for new teachers can improve teacher retention, accelerate teacher effectiveness and increase the achievement of their students. Our model not only helps to create strong new teachers, but also improves their long-term success in their school districts.

NTC is identified across the nation with high-quality programs for new teacher mentoring and induction. At the heart of this work is the conviction that when we focus on teachers, we positively impact student learning and create positive, sustainable change in participating school systems. The Chronicle of Higher Education has called NTC the "gold standard" of induction programs.

In 2011, NTC trained over 7,534 mentors and 3,516 principals who supported 24,195 beginning teachers, touching the lives of almost 1.5 million students. NTC has grown from managing a handful of induction and mentoring engagements in 1998, to working in 35 states and approximately 250 school districts. The organization has a \$19 million annual operating budget and a staff of 190.

With a main office in Santa Cruz, NTC also has offices in New York City, Chicago, Durham, and Wisconsin. NTC has had multi-year engagements with Austin, Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, New York City, Rhode Island, Tulsa, and other states and school districts over the past decade. In each case, we developed, structured, and supported large-scale teacher induction programs. These fee-for-service partnerships support more than half of NTC's operating budget.

Major foundations such as Carnegie Corporation of New York, Ford Foundation, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, the Skoll Foundation, and top venture philanthropy groups such as Full Circle Fund, NewSchools Venture Fund, New Profit, and SeaChange Capital Partners have all invested in New Teacher Center's growth.
