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PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT 2013-2014

This Agreement is entered into between the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) and Trumpet Behavioral Health (CONTRACTOR). OUSD is authorized by Government Code Section 53060 to contract for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal, and administrative matters with persons specially trained, experienced, and competent to perform such services. - 9. Status of Contractor: This is not an employment contract. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

10. Insurance:

- 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance: Unless specifically waived by OUSD, the following insurance is required:

Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

- iv. CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain any insurance under this agreement. (Completed and approved Waiver of Insurance Form is required.) Waiver of insurance does not release CONTRACTOR from responsibility for any claim or demand.
- 11. Licenses and Permits: CONTRACTOR shall obtain and keep in force all licenses, permits, and certificates necessary for the performance of this Agreement.

- Anti-Discrimination. - Indemnification: CONTRACTOR agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses accruing or resulting from injury, damage, or death of any person, firm, or corporation in connection with the performance of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR also agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend OUSD and its elective board, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims or losses incurred by any supplier, contractor, or subcontractor furnishing work, services, or materials to CONTRACTOR in connection with the performance of this Agreement. This provision survives termination of this Agreement.
- Copyright/Trademark/Patent/Ownership CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of OUSD and cannot be used without OUSD's express written permission. OUSD shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark, and/or patent of said matter in the name of OUSD. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium. These matters include, without limitation, drawings, plans, specifications, studies, reports, memoranda, computation sheets, the contents of computer diskettes, artwork, copy, posters, billboards, photographs, videotapes, audiotapes, systems designs, software, reports, diagrams, surveys, source codes or any other original works of authorship, or other documents prepared by CONTRACTOR or its Sub-CONTRACTORs in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement. All works shall be works for hire as defined under Title 17 of the United States Code and all copyrights in those works are the property of OUSD.
- 17 Waiver: No delay or omission by either party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right or prevent a similar subsequent act from constituting a violation of the Agreement.
- Termination: OUSD may at any time terminate this Agreement upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to OUSD exceeds the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall pay the additional cost.

- 20 No Rights in Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any nghts in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein
- 21. OUSD's Evaluation of CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR's Employees and/or Subcontractors. O USD may evaluate the CONTRACTOR's work in any way that OUSD is entitled to do so pursuant to applicable law. The OUSD's evaluation may include, without limitation:
 - 1 Requesting that OUSD employee(s) evaluate the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.

The program supports Oakland Unified's adopted Positive Behavior Intervention Support initiative and will be utilized in a Pilot with both general education students, as well as special education students. The focus will be to create capacity within District staff to better serve students in a consistent, timely manner, while reducing costs for student placements in non-public schools and costly support from non-public agencies. The initial Pilot of the program will include 1,000 Licenses (Students) of Insights to Behavior for a cost of \$150 per license, totally \$150,000.

Professional Development is a critical piece of all successful implementations. The Pilot will include 5 days of onsite training with Insights' lead BCBA that has led dozens of successful launch trainings. These trainings will be used to get the initial teams an understanding on the functionality and use of the program. This can include training of the principals and key staff at each of the targeted campuses, as we well as the special ed team and clinicians that will be involved in developing the behavior plans. The cost of these professional development days is \$2,500 per day, which includes travel cost.

Contracted Professional Services from two Clinicians to support in the classroom and at the implementation sites to provide a very successful model for mentoring and coaching. These personnel will be available for up to 40 hrs per week to work with the special ed teams, as well as other target groups within the district using Insights. The key purpose of these clinicians will be to create sustainability and expertise in each target area. Daily activities will likely include training, classroom observations, case review, and a collaborative session on classroom strategies and interventions. The initial year of these services as outlined is \$120,000 for each clinician totaling \$360,000.
