

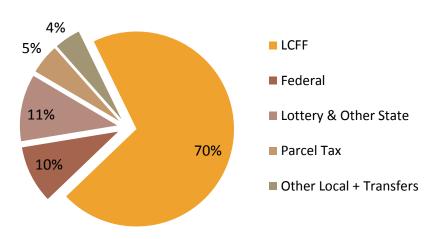

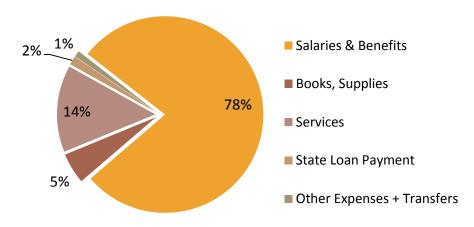
Total General Fund Revenues and Expenses

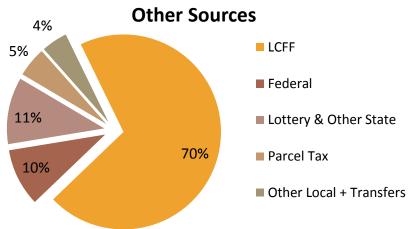

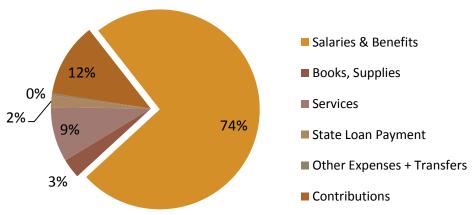
Unrestricted General Fund Revenues and Expenses
