Child Abuse Prevention And Reporting

The Governing Board recognizes that is committed to supporting the safety and well-being of district has a responsibility to protect-students by facilitating and desires to facilitate the prompt prevention of and response to child abuse and neglect. The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement strategies for preventing, recognizing, and promptly reporting of known and or suspected child abuse and neglect.

The Superintendent or designee may provide a student who is a victim of abuse with school-based mental health services or other support services and/or may refer the student to resources available within the community as needed.

Child Abuse Prevention

The district's instructional program shall include age-appropriate and culturally sensitive child abuse prevention curriculum. This curriculum shall explain students' right to live free of abuse, include instruction in the skills and techniques needed to identify unsafe situations and react appropriately and promptly, inform students of available support resources, and teach students how to obtain help and disclose incidents of child abuse and neglect. abuse.

The Superintendent or designee shall, to the extent feasible, seek to incorporate community resources into the district's child abuse prevention programs and may use these resources to provide parents/guardians with instruction in parenting skills and child abuse prevention.

Child Abuse Reporting

The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures for the identification and reporting of such incidentsknown and suspected child abuse and neglect in accordance with law.

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Procedures for reporting child abuse shall be included in the district and/or school comprehensive safety plan. (Education Code 32282)

Employees District employees who are mandated reporters, as defined by law and district administrative regulation, are obligated to report all known or suspected incidents of child abuse and neglect. Mandated reporters shall not investigate any suspected incidents but rather shall cooperate with agencies responsible for reporting, investigating and prosecuting cases of childabuse and neglect.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide training regarding the reporting duties of mandated reporters. In addition to the existing authority vested in the Superintendent to implement Board Policies, the Superintendent shall issue appropriate discipline to any employee, who after appropriate notice and opportunity to complete the mandatory training, does not complete the required training described in the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act.

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In the event that training is not provided to mandated reporters, the Superintendent or designeeshall report to the California Department of Education the reasons that such training is not provided. (Penal Code 11165.7)

Parents/guardians may contact the Superintendent or designee to obtain procedures for filing a complaint against a district employee or other person whom they suspect has engaged in abuse of a child at a school site.
