As requested, Professional Service Industries, Inc. (PSI) has completed this Addendum No. 1 to the referenced geotechnical report for the subject site. As you requested, additional drilled and helical pier foundation recommendations are provided in this letter to address the need to resist 25,000 pounds of allowable overturn/uplift force at the subject site.

#### **Drilled Pier Foundations**

<u>Vertical Load Resistance – Axial Loading</u> – A drilled pier that is extended to a minimum depth of 5 feet below existing finish grade can be designed using an allowable downward frictional resistance of 400 pounds per square foot (psf) and an allowable uplift frictional resistance of 200 psf, provided soil conditions are as encountered in our exploratory borings. End-bearing capacity should be ignored unless the bottom of the drilled pier is inspected and cleaned to remove all loose materials. If the bottom of the piers are inspected and are found free of loose materials, an allowable end-bearing of 2,000 psf can be used in combination with the allowable frictional resistance to arrive at the total pier capacity. The allowable skin friction includes a factor of safety of at least two, and the allowable end-bearing capacity includes a factor of safety of at least three. Both the allowable skin friction and the allowable end-bearing can be increased by one-third for loads of short duration, including wind and seismic forces. For the purpose of design, the allowable skin friction should be ignored in the top two feet of the drilled pier.

It should be noted that the pier capacities presented above are based on the strength of the soils and the anticipated construction conditions; concrete and reinforcement steel must be designed to accommodate anticipated stresses due to axial and lateral loads and the bending moments.

The actual pier diameter, embedment depth, and other aspects of the pier design should ultimately be determined by the structural engineer based on the structural requirements. Drilled pier diameter and embedment should be determined based on the recommendations contained herein and the structural engineer's analysis, in accordance with the pier type/dimension, calculated live/dead loads, and predicted overturning moment. PSI should review pier design to confirm that it is consistent with the recommendations provided in our report.

Lateral Load Resistance - A drilled, cast-in-place, reinforced concrete pier should be embedded sufficiently to resist the combination of shear and axial loads, and overturning moments. Lateral loads may be resisted by any method that incorporates lateral earth pressure and/or horizontal subgrade reaction. The design may incorporate a passive earth pressure of 400 psf/ft if the pier concrete is poured tightly against relatively undisturbed native earth materials. The passive resistance of the top two feet of the drilled pier should be ignored unless confined by paving. The passive earth pressure below a depth of two feet can be applied to a width of two times the design drilled pier diameter. The maximum passive resistance should not exceed 5,000 psf. The passive resistance value may be increased by one-third when subject to transient loading conditions such as seismic impact or wind load. We recommend that PSI be provided with the design lateral load and bending moment when they become available, such that the behavior of the laterally-loaded piers can be checked and pier design recommendations verified.

<u>Drilled Pier Excavation Considerations</u> – Drilled pier excavations in sandy soils may experience sloughing and cave-ins. Casing or other stabilization methods should be made available at the project site prior to drilling. The bottom of the drilled pier excavation should be firm and free of loose material prior to the placement of concrete. The suitability of the bearing material for support of the pier should be verified by PSI prior to placement of reinforcing steel or concrete. After opening, foundation excavations should be observed and concrete placed as quickly as possible to avoid exposure of the foundation bottoms to wetting and drying. Surface run-off water should be drained away from the excavations and not be allowed to pond. We recommend that the foundation concrete should be placed during the same day the excavation is made. If it is required that foundation excavations be left open for more than one day, they should be properly covered to prevent personal injury and fall hazards, and be protected to reduce evaporation or entry of moisture.

Dependent upon the structural design, groundwater may be encountered at the bottom of pier foundation excavations. If concrete is placed within an excavation containing groundwater, it should be placed from the bottom of the excavation using a tremie or similar method. This is intended to allow the concrete to displace groundwater as it is placed.

#### **Helical Mini-Piles**

Helical Mini-Piles may also be used to resist uplift forces. A specialty contractor/installer should be contacted for specific pier capacity, suitability, and constructability of the helical mini-pile system. PSI recommends that helical mini-piles be embedded a minimum of 15 feet into firm soils.



#### Limitations

The professional services have been performed, findings obtained, and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally accepted geotechnical engineering principles and practices at the time of this report. PSI is not responsible for the conclusions, opinions, or recommendations made by others based on this data. No other warranties are implied or expressed. This report has been prepared for the exclusive use of the Oakland Unified Schools District and their affiliates and subsidiaries for the specific application to the proposed addition at the subject site.

The analyses and recommendations submitted in this report are based upon the data obtained from the soil borings performed at the locations indicated. If any subsoil variations become evident during the course of this project, a re-evaluation of the recommendations contained in this report will be necessary after we have had an opportunity to observe the characteristics of the conditions encountered. The applicability of the report should also be reviewed in the event significant changes occur in the design, nature, or location of the proposed improvements.

If there are any revisions to the plans for this project or if deviations from the subsurface conditions noted in this or any supplemental report prepared by PSI are encountered during construction, PSI should be notified immediately to determine if changes in our recommendations are required. If PSI is not retained to perform these functions, PSI will not be responsible for the impact of those conditions on the project.

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

#### INDEPENDENT CONSULTANT AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (Geotechnical Testing Services)

This Independent Consultant Agreement for Professional Services ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of the <u>31st day of October</u>, <u>2014</u> by and between the **Oakland Unified School District** ("District") and <u>Professional Services Industries (PSI)</u> ("Consultant"), (individually a "Party" or collectively the "Parties").

**WHEREAS,** The District is authorized by Section 4529.12 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of architecture, landscape architecture, engineering, environmental services, land surveying, and construction management through a fair, competitive selection process.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- Services. The Consultant shall provide the services as described in Exhibit "A<sub>y</sub>" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference ("Services" or "Work"). The scope of services will generally consist of professional engineering services and geotechnical testing services.
  - 1.1. The Services shall be performed on the following project(s) / site(s) ("Project"):

The Consultant's Services at any one of the sites or combination thereof may be changed, including terminated, in the same manner as the Project, as indicated herein, without changing in any way the remaining Consultant's Services at other site(s). The provisions of this Agreement shall apply to the Consultant's Services at each site, without regard to the status of the remaining Project component(s). Consultant shall invoice for each inspection and test separately and for each site separately and District shall compensate Consultant for each site separately on a proportionate basis based on the level and scope of Services completed for each site.
- 2. **Term.** Unless terminated or otherwise cancelled as permitted herein, the term of this Agreement shall be for the following:

District agrees to pay the Consultant for Services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a total fee not to exceed <u>Nine thousand, five hundred and sixty-five dollars (\$9,565.00)</u>. District shall pay Consultant according to the following terms and conditions:

Consultant shall comply with the requirements of the District's L/SL/SLRBE Program, as applicable, which may require a fifty percent (50%) mandatory minimum local participation requirement in the performance of this Agreement. A copy of the District's L/SL/SLRBE Program can be obtained on the District website, at <u>www.ousd.k12.ca.us</u>, under the Facilities Planning & Management Department drop down menu, Bids and Requests for Proposals.

In light of the fifty percent (50%) L/SL/SLRBE participation requirement for formally bid professional service contracts, good faith effort documentation is not necessary.

- 8. Designated Representatives / Labor Compliance Program. Consultant shall coordinate with District personnel and/or its designated representatives as may be requested and desirable, including with other professionals employed by the District for the design, coordination or management of other work related to the Project. This shall include, without limitation, coordination with the persons responsible for operation of the District's Labor Compliance Program. If Consultant employs subcontractor(s), Consultant shall ensure that its contract(s) with its subcontractor(s) include language notifying the subcontractor(s) of the District's Labor Compliance Program, if any.
- 9. Materials. Consultant shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor; materials, equipment,

#### 11. Performance of Services.

- 11.1. Standard of Care. Consultant represents that Consultant has the qualifications and ability to perform the Services in a professional manner, without the advice, control or supervision of District. Consultant's Services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession for services to California school districts.
- 11.2. **Meetings.** Consultant and District agree to participate in regular meetings on at least a monthly basis to discuss strategies, timetables, implementations of services, and any other issues deemed relevant to the operation of Consultant's performance of Services.
- 11.3. District Approval. Work completed pursuant to this Agreement must meet the approval of the District and shall be subject to the District's general right of inspection and supervision to secure the satisfactory completion thereof.
- 11.4. **New Project Approval.** Consultant and District recognize that Consultant's Services may include working on various projects for District. Consultant shall obtain the approval of District prior to the commencement of a new project.
- 12. Originality of Services. Except as to standard generic details, Consultant agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays and video productions prepared for, written for, or submitted to the District and/or used in connection with this Agreement, shall be wholly original to Consultant and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to Consultant by District as a basis for such services.
- 13. Copyright/Trademark/Patent. Consultant understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. District shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the District. Consultant consents to use of Consultant's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

#### 14. Audit.

14.1. Consultant shall establish and maintain books, records, and systems of account, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, reflecting all business operations of Consultant transacted under this Agreement. Consultant shall retain these books, records, and systems of account during the Term of this Agreement and for five (5) years thereafter. Consultant shall permit the District, its agent, other representatives, or an independent auditor to audit, examine, and make excerpts, copies, and transcripts from all books and records, and to make audit(s) of all billing statements, invoices, records, and other data related to the Services covered by this Agreement. Audit(s) may be performed at any time, provided that the District shall give reasonable prior notice to Consultant and shall conduct audit(s) during Consultant's normal business hours, unless Consultant otherwise consents. For a period of three (3) years after final payment under this Agreement, all expenditures of public funds in

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excess of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) shall be subject to examination and audit by the State Auditor. The audit shall be confined to those matters connected with the performance of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the costs of administering the Agreement.

#### 15. Termination.

- 15.1. Without Cause By District. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Consultant only for the Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services by Consultant. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Consultant or no later than three (3) days after the day the notice was mailed, whichever is sooner.
- 15.2. Without Cause By Consultant. Consultant may, upon thirty (30) days notice, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement. Upon this termination, District shall only be obligated to compensate Consultant for Services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by Consultant shall be sufficient to stop further performance of Services to District. Consultant acknowledges that this thirty (30) day notice period is acceptable so that the District can attempt to procure the Services from another source.
- 15.3. With Cause By District. District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
  - 15.3.1. material violation of this Agreement by the Consultant; or
  - 15.3.2. any act by Consultant exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
  - 15.3.3. Consultant is adjudged a bankrupt, Consultant makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Consultant's insolvency.

Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such Intention to terminate and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, the District may secure the Services from another Consultant. If the expense, fees, and/or costs to the District exceeds the cost of providing the Services pursuant to this Agreement, the Consultant shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

16. Indemnification. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, Consultant shall defend, indemnify, and hold free and harmless the District, its agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("the indemnified parties") from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, costs, expenses, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, in law or equity ("Claim"), to property or persons, including personal injury and/or death, to the extent that any of the above arise out of, pertain to, or relate to the negligence, recklessness, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Consultant, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, consultants, or agents directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of the Services, the Project, or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages.

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#### 17. Insurance.

- 17.1. The Consultant shall procure and maintain at all times it performs any portion of the Services the following insurance with minimum limits equal to the amount indicated below.
  - 17.1.1. Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance. Commercial General Liability Insurance and Any Auto Automobile Liability Insurance that shall protect the Consultant, the District, and the State from all claims of bodily injury, property damage, personal injury, death, advertising injury, and medical payments arising performing any portion of the Services. (Form CG 0001 and CA 0001, or forms substantially similar, if approved by the District.)
  - 17.1.2. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance. Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employers' Liability Insurance for all of its employees performing any portion of the Services. In accordance with provisions of section 3700 of the California Labor Code, the Consultant shall be required to secure workers' compensation coverage for its employees. If any class of employee or employees engaged in performing any portion of the Services under this Agreement are not protected under the Workers' Compensation Statute, adequate insurance coverage for the protection of any employee(s) not otherwise protected must be obtained before any of those employee(s) commence performing any portion of the Services.

- 17.2. **Proof of Carriage of Insurance**. The Consultant shall not commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverage have been delivered in duplicate to the District and approved by the District. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following:
  - 17.2.1. A clause stating: "This policy shall not be canceled or reduced in required limits of liability or amounts of insurance until notice has been mailed to the District, stating date of cancellation or reduction. Date of cancellation or reduction shall not be less than thirty (30) days after date of mailing notice."
  - 17.2.2. Language stating in particular those insured, extent of insurance, location and operation to which insurance applies, expiration date, to whom cancellation and reduction notice will be sent, and length of notice period.

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- 17.2.3. An endorsement stating that the District and the State and their agents, representatives, employees, trustees, officers, consultants, and volunteers are named additional insured under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance, Professional Liability, and Employers' Liability Insurance. An endorsement shall also state that Consultant's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District.
- 17.2.4. All policies except the Professional Liability Policy shall be written on an occurrence form.
- 17.3. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.
- 18. Assignment. The obligations and liabilities of the Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned voluntarily by the Consultant nor assigned by operation of law.
- Binding Contract. This Agreement shall be binding upon the Parties hereto and upon their successors and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of the Parties and their successors and assigns.
- 20. **Compliance with Laws**. Consultant shall observe and comply with all rules and regulations of the governing board of the District and all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances and regulations. If Consultant performs any work that is in violation of any laws, ordinances, rules or regulations, without first notifying the District of the violation, Consultant shall bear all costs arising therefrom.
- 21. Certificates/Permits/Licenses. Consultant and all Consultant's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement, including without limitation all licenses required to perform professional engineering services and geotechnical testing services.
- 22. Employment with Public Agency. Consultant, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Consultant will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which Services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 23. Anti-Discrimination. It is the policy of the District that in connection with all work performed under contracts there be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age and therefore the Consultant agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and District policy. In addition, the Consultant agrees to require like compliance by all its subcontractor(s).

24. Fingerprinting of Employees. The Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation

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Certification must be completed and attached to this Agreement prior to Consultant's performing of any portion of the Services.

- 25. **Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises.** Section 17076.11 of the Education Code requires school districts using funds allocated pursuant to the State of California School Facility Program for the construction or modernization of a school building to have a participation goal of at least three percent (3%), per year, of the overall dollar amount expended each year by the school district, for disabled veteran business enterprises (DVBE). In accordance therewith, the Consultant must submit, upon request by District, appropriate documentation to the District identifying the steps the Consultant has taken to solicit DVBE participation in conjunction with this Agreement, if applicable.
- 26. No Rights In Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 27. District's Evaluation of Consultant and Consultant's Employees and/or Subcontractors. The District may evaluate the Consultant in any way the District is entitled pursuant to applicable law. The District's evaluation may include, without limitation:
  - 27.1. Requesting that District employee(s) evaluate the Consultant and the Consultant's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
  - 27.2. Announced and unannounced observance of Consultant, Consultant's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).
- 28. Limitation of District Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, District's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall District be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.
- 29. **Disputes**. Consultant understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.
- 31. Notice. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given, served, and received if given in writing and either personally delivered or deposited in the United States mail, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt required, or sent by overnight delivery service, or facsimile transmission, addressed as follows:

The Parties further agree that any action or proceeding brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be maintained in the county in which the District's administrative offices are located.
- **34.Waiver**. The waiver by either Party of any breach of any term, covenant, or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant, condition, or any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition herein contained.
- 35.Severability. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

Per your request, Professional Service Industries, Inc. (PSI) is pleased to submit this proposal for a geotechnical investigation for the subject project. This proposal includes a review of furnished project information and outlines the services we propose to offer on this project, our fee, schedule, and the General Conditions that will apply.

#### **PROJECT INFORMATION**

A site plan showing existing improvements and the area of the proposed addition was provided for our use in preparing this proposal. From information provided by you, PSI understands that it is proposed to build an approximately 600 square foot, single-story addition to the existing Multi-Use Room structure at the subject site, for use as a kitchen facility. Other improvements are likely to include utilities and concrete flatwork. New pavements are not expected.

Details such as expected loading have not been provided, but based on the type of development planned, we expect individual column and bearing wall loads of approximately 20 kips and 2 kips per lineal foot, respectively. For the purposes of this proposal, we will assume finish exterior grades to be near (+/- two feet) existing grades. Should any of the above information or assumptions made by PSI be inconsistent with the planned construction, we request that you contact us immediately to allow us to make any necessary modifications to this proposal.

Based upon review of geologic data, we anticipate that the site is underlain by bedrock of the Great Valley complex, described as sandstone, siltstone, shale, and conglomerate. Based on the Oakland East Seismic Hazard Zone report (CGS, 2003) groundwater depth at the site is expected to be greater than 10 feet below existing site grades. The site is not within an Alquist-Priolo Earthquake Fault Zone but is within an area that is mapped by the state of California as a Seismic

Hazard Zone for landsliding. Based on our review of a historical aerial photo from 1938, it appears that a landslide was present across the area of the exiting Multi-Use Room, which coincides with the landslide hazard area of the Seismic Hazard Zone map. Based on a current aerial photo and our previous site walk, there has clearly been significant remedial grading in this landslide area – either for the residential development, for the existing school (both at the base of the existing slope) or for the water tank / reservoir (near the top of the slope). Based on our review of the California Division of the State Architect (DSA) form IR A-4.13, a Geohazard Report is expected to be required for this project.

#### SITE DESCRIPTION

Based on our review of maps, recent aerial photographs and PSI's previous site walk, the site is a vacant landscaped (lawn) area located on the north side of the Henry Kaiser Elementary School campus, between the Multi-Use Room and the parking lot at the southern terminus of South Hill Court. The site is bordered on the north by an asphalt-paved parking lot followed by residential properties and on all other sides by the existing Henry Kaiser Elementary School.

This proposal has been written with the assumption that the proposed drilling locations will be clear and accessible to the truck-mounted drill rig and that and that concrete coring will not be required. Should any of the above information or assumptions made by PSI be inconsistent with the planned construction, we request that you contact us immediately to allow us to make any necessary modifications to this proposal. Our proposed scope of services for the work is discussed below.

#### PROPOSED SCOPE OF SERVICES

The following proposed scope of services pertains to a subsurface exploration for geotechnical purposes only. The scope of services for this phase of work does not include any environmental assessment for the presence or absence of wetlands or hazardous or toxic materials in the soil, surface water, groundwater, or air, on, below, or around the site.

We propose to advance 2 soil test borings within the footprint of the proposed new structure. The borings will be drilled to 10 feet and 40 feet below existing grade, to borehole instability, or to practical auger refusal, whichever is shallower. The anticipated total linear feet of drilling is 50 feet. Fieldwork is expected to take one working day to complete.

The soil test borings will be performed with a truck-mounted, rotary auger drill rig. Representative soil samples will be obtained at increments of 2.5 feet in the upper 10 feet and at 5 foot intervals thereafter. Split-barrel sampling procedures will be employed in general accordance with ASTM D1586. Where cohesive soils are encountered, thin walled tube samples may be obtained in accordance with ASTM D1587.

A minimum of two working days prior to performing the field drilling services, PSI will locate the proposed borings in the field by measuring distances from existing site landmarks or property boundaries identified on the site plan to be provided by you. A representative of PSI will then call Underground Service Alert to notify utilities and public service agencies of the proposed drilling.



PSI will not be responsible for locating any private underground utilities. You are responsible for locating and identifying all private utilities prior to drilling. If you choose, for an additional **\$650.00**, PSI will provide a subcontract utility location service to check the boring locations for existing private underground utilities. All field services will be coordinated with a site contact(s) as designated by you. Also prior to drilling, PSI will obtain a drilling permit from the Alameda County Public Works Agency (ACPWA).

At the completion of drilling, PSI will backfill the borings with cement grout in accordance with ACPWA permit requirements. The soil cuttings generated during the drilling activities can be spread within the unpaved, landscaped area on the north side of the parking lot, or in an alternate location to be chosen by the site contact.

Representative soil samples obtained during the field exploration program will be returned to the laboratory for classification and a limited number of engineering properties tests. The nature and extent of this laboratory testing program will be dependent upon the subsurface conditions encountered during the field exploration program, and may include testing of selected samples to evaluate the soils' moisture content, consolidation properties, grain-size, relative strength characteristics, expansion potential and soil corrosivity.

At the conclusion of our field and laboratory work, the data will be analyzed by one of our experienced geotechnical engineers and reports will be prepared. The reports will include the following:

- Our understanding of the project.
- A geologic overview of the project area.
- Site topographic information and surface conditions.
- A discussion of subsurface conditions encountered including pertinent soil properties and groundwater conditions.
- Logs of borings with soil classification per the Unified Soil Classification System (USCS).
- Figures, to include a Site Location Map, Regional Geologic and Fault Hazard Maps.
- An evaluation of the data as it relates to the proposed site development.
- An evaluation of Geologic Hazards as they relate to the proposed site development.
- A site-specific ground motion hazard analysis to provide design response spectrum and design acceleration parameters.
- Site grading and cut/fill considerations, including recommended fill material characteristics and compaction requirements for general site fill, and slab subgrades, including an assessment as to the suitability of on-site soils for use as fill.
- Recommendations pertaining to design and construction of foundations and floor slabs, including allowable soil bearing pressures, anticipated bearing depths and estimated settlements.
- Comments and recommendations relating to other observed geotechnical conditions that could impact the development.



Upon initiation of our services, PSI will contact you regarding the availability of previous geotechnical information, such as the Geotechnical Study for the existing School / Multi-Use Room and for the grading of the landslide area.

The Geotechnical Engineering report will be reviewed and signed by a California Registered Geotechnical Engineer (GE) and a California Engineering Geologist (CEG), as required for project submission to the Division of the State Architect (DSA).

#### Excluded Services

While the hazard of seismically-induced landsliding will be addressed in our report based on a review of the available information, a slope stability analysis is not included in our scope of services. PSI expects that landslide debris that may have existed within the limits of the proposed addition have been removed during previous remedial grading operations for the original construction of the school. For the purpose of this investigation for the proposed addition, PSI has not included any geologic mapping, bucket-auger holes or downhole geologic logging, nor is it part of this scope to evaluate the limits or the depths of potential landslide slip surfaces. If such evaluations are deemed necessary by you or the local and State governing jurisdictions, please contact us to revise this proposal for those additional services.

#### Limited Environmental Sampling

As part of the geotechnical investigation, PSI will collect four soil samples from the upper two feet of soil at the site to be composited into one sample for environmental analyses. The composite sample will be analyzed for volatile organic compounds (VOCs) according to EPA Method 8260, petroleum hydrocarbon speciation according to EPA Method 8015M, and for total metals (17 metals) according to EPA Method 6010. PSI understands that the soil sample analyses is for off-haul characterization. PSI will present the results of the environmental sampling in a letter, which shows the soil sample location and provides the analytical results.

#### SCHEDULE

We can begin our work for the geotechnical exploration immediately upon receiving written authorization to begin. PSI anticipates that we can obtain the necessary permits and mobilize to the site within five to ten working days after receiving project authorization. Assuming favorable weather conditions and an anticipated 1 working day for field and 10 working days for laboratory activities, PSI proposes to deliver the report in 15 working days from completion of the fieldwork.

#### FEES

PSI will perform the described geotechnical study for a lump sum fee of **\$8,565.00.** PSI understands that the subcontract drilling company will be subject to Prevailing Wage requirements, which are included in our estimate. Our fee assumes that all exploration locations will be accessible at the time of mobilization and that no delays or additional mobilizations will be required due to inaccessible boring locations. Boring, sampling, and testing requirements are a function of the subsurface conditions encountered. This estimated cost assumes that adequate bearing materials will be encountered within the planned boring depths. If unsuitable materials are encountered, the boring may need to be extended.

Additional work required beyond the scope of services included in this proposal (e.g., access problems, or other such factors beyond PSI's control) will be invoiced on a time and expense (cost plus 20%) basis. We will not exceed the Lump Sum Fee without your prior approval.

Our fee estimates cover the activities required to present our findings in report form. Our fees do not include time to prepare construction specifications, attend special meetings, conferences or any other activities requested after submittal of our reports.

#### LIMITATIONS

The services proposed herein are conventional in nature and do not include any special services that may lessen the risk of conditions that can contribute to moisture, mold or other microbial contaminant amplification in buildings. You may be aware that mold is abundant throughout nature and is comprised of a wide variety of microscopic fungi. Due to its nature, the potential for mold infestations cannot be completely eliminated. However, PSI offers a wide array of professional Moisture, Waterproofing, Roofing and Indoor Air Quality/Mold Consulting services that can help minimize the likelihood of future occurrences. PSI is interested in discussing these service options with you to suit your specific needs and project objectives. If requested, PSI will submit a proposal for these additional services under a separate cover for your review and authorization.
