### UNIVERSITY SERVICES AGREEMENT OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (University), on behalf of its Cress Center in the Davis School of Education (the Facility) and the OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (OUSD) in care of the Oakland Public Education Fund.

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, The Facility has been established and is maintained to support University's pursuit of its constitutional objectives of instruction, research, and public service; and

WHEREAS, the services of the Facility may be extended to non-University users (including, when permitted by University policy, University students, faculty, and staff requesting such services for their personal use) only when, in the sole judgment of University, such action will serve purposes consistent with University's objectives and will not adversely affect the conduct of University activities; and

WHEREAS, the services requested by QUSD have been determined to serve purposes consistent with University objectives and their provision to OUSD not to adversely affect the conduct of University activities; and

WHEREAS, OUSD has determined that the services in question cannot be adequately performed by other agencies or commercial firms; and

NOW, THEREFORE, University shall furnish the following services to OUSD.

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- Services. University shall develop partnership between SAYS (Sacramento Area Youth Speaks) program and the Manhood Development Program at OUSD, as more fully described in "Exhibit A", attached hereto and incorporated herein. Additional work shall be performed only if authorized in advance by written amendment to this agreement executed by both parties. To the extent that any provision of Exhibit A is inconsistent with this agreement, this agreement shall take precedence. OUSD's addendum or purchase order shall have no effect on the terms and conditions of this agreement.
- Priority of University work. University work always has priority over work to be performed for non-University users.
- Term. The term of this agreement shall be from the date of the last signature below, through date, June 30, 2015.
- 4. Payment. Fees for services by facility shall be based upon Facility's approved rate of \$350.00 per hour, plus reimbursement of actual expense costs, and shall not exceed \$41,200.00. (Though Exhibit A lists a cost for each objective, each cost is an estimate based on approved rate and estimated expenses.) In no event shall the not-to-exceed value of the agreement be increased absent a written amendment between the parties. OUSD shall pay for services within 30 days of OUSD's receipt of University's invoices; Facility reserves the right to suspend performance of services if OUSD fails to make payment in full within 60 days.

- 5. <u>Indemnification and Insurance</u>. The parties shall defend, indemnify, and hold one another, their officers, employees, and agents, harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages arising out of or in connection with this agreement, but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its officers, agents or employees.
  - 5.1. <u>Bvidence of Insurance</u>. Upon University's request, OUSD shall provide University written evidence of OUSD's insurance coverage relevant to the presence or activity of OUSD, its officers, agents, and employees while in, on or about University property. In the event OUSD's coverage is not acceptable to University, University shall have the right to immediately suspend services. If OUSD fails to provide acceptable insurance within 10 days after University's written notice, University may terminate this agreement.
  - 5.2. Patent Infringement. OUSD shall indemnify University, its agents and employees, against all liability (including costs and expenses incurred) for use of any invention or discovery and for the infringement of any Letter Patent (not including liability arising pursuant to U.S. Code section 183, Title 35 (1952) prior to the issuance of Letters Patent) occurring during the performance of this agreement and resulting from OUSD's request or instruction that the Facility utilize any device, method, or technique not normally utilized by the Facility.

### 6. Non-Liability of University.

- 6.1. <u>Consequential Damages</u>. University shall not be liable for any loss of profits, claims against OUSD by any third party, or consequential damages.
- 6.2. <u>Delay/Desired Result</u>. University shall incur no liability to OUSD or to any third party for any loss, cost, claim or damage, either direct or consequential, arising from University's delay in performance or failure to perform services, or failure to achieve a desired result.
- 6.3. Property Damage. University shall incur no liability to OUSD or to any third party for loss or destruction of or damage to any materials to be sampled, assayed, or tested, data, equipment, or other property brought upon University premises by OUSD or delivered to University by OUSD in connection with this agreement. OUSD accepts all liability for risk of loss to any and all such property.
- 6.4. <u>Liability Limitation</u>. University's liability for damages shall not exceed the total of all charges paid by OUSD.
- 7. Confidential Information. During the course of this agreement, OUSD may provide University with information, data, or material that it regards as proprietary or confidential. Such information shall be marked or stamped "CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION". If communicated orally to University, OUSD shall submit confirmation in writing within five days of such disclosure.

- 7.1. University's Obligation. University shall treat OUSD's Confidential Information in the same manner as University treats its own similar information. Upon OUSD's written request, University shall protect OUSD's Confidential Information by means not normally employed by University; however, University shall have no obligation to comply with any such request by OUSD. Should such protection occur, any related costs shall be borne by OUSD. University shall not be liable for inadvertent disclosure of Confidential Information provided University has exercised reasonable care.
- 7.2. Exempt Information. Confidential Information does not include information that is (i) not exempt from disclosure under the California Public Records Act (Calif. Gov. Code sec. 6250 et seq.); (ii) otherwise available to the public; (iii) rightfully received from a third party not in breach of an obligation of confidentiality; (iv) independently developed by University; (v) previously known to University; or (vi) produced in compliance with a court order or when required by law. University shall give reasonable notice to OUSD that Confidential Information is being sought by a third party, to afford OUSD an opportunity to limit or prevent disclosure. Any defense against disclosure shall be at OUSD's sole initiative, risk, cost, and expense. University is not obligated to participate in any defense against such request for disclosure. Upon OUSD's request, University agrees to cease using all Confidential Information and to return it promptly to OUSD.
- 7.3. <u>Time Limitation</u>. University shall not divulge OUSD's Confidential Information for a period of three years following termination of this agreement, or earlier if OUSD makes or allows its Confidential Information to become public knowledge, or by communicating such Confidential Information to a party not bound by an obligation of confidentiality.
- 7.4. <u>Disposition of Confidential Information</u>. Upon completion of services or termination of this agreement, by OUSD's written request, University shall return any Confidential Information. Absent such request, Facility shall destroy or dispose of it according to its established procedures.
- 8. Disclaimer of Wartanty. UNIVERSITY MAKES NO WARRANTY AS TO RESULTS TO BE OBTAINED BY THE USER FROM THE USE OF ANY SERVICES AND/OR FACILITIES PROVIDED BY UNIVERSITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. THERE ARE NO EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.
- 9. Shipment of Restricted Materials. In the event that OUSD will be providing materials to be sampled, assayed, or used by University in providing Services hereunder whose shipment would require authorization or permits from governmental authorities (including return of any such materials to OUSD following completion of Services or termination of this agreement), application for such authorization or permit shall be solely at OUSD's initiative, risk, cost, and expense.

- 10. University's Right to Use Data. University shall have the unrestricted right to use for its own purposes, including publication, any data or information which it may develop in connection with or as a result of performing the services described in Exhibit A.
- 11. <u>Use of University's Name</u>. Except for the purpose of the services shown in section 1, OUSD shall not use the name or mark of University in any form or manner in advertisements, reports, or other information released to the public without the prior written approval of University.
- 12. <u>Termination</u>. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon ten days written notice to the other party.
