Recommendation:

Approval of a long-term lease agreement between OUSD and KIPP Bay Area to house KIPP Bridge TK-8 at the Lafayette Elementary Campus beginning fall, 2016.

Approval of the relocation of the District-run Lafayette Elementary program to the Lowell campus, co-located with the West Oakland Middle School program, to create a TK-8 program continuum.





A1 - West Oakland Call: Focus Areas

West Oakland Innovation & Feeder Renewal



The FOCUS of the West Oakland Call has been:



- 1. Building <u>West Oakland principal's capacity</u> to lead transformation through ongoing monthly Professional Development and Bi-weekly Community of Practice
- 2. Developing a <u>Regional Committee Structure</u> in West Oakland to host learning about the Quality School Development Pillars and empowering community to inform individual site transformation planning
- 3. Establishing a <u>Visioning</u> team and <u>root cause analysis</u> process at each West Oakland Call site to develop <u>Pre-Planning Proposals</u> intended to build readiness for a 2016-17 design year (due May 12 for review and feedback)
- 4. Conducting the <u>evaluation</u> and subsequent Board <u>approval</u> process for a <u>KIPP TK-8</u> <u>program</u> to begin serving grades TK-4 in 2016-17
- 5. Coordinating an inclusive and collaborative <u>Prop 39 process</u> with KIPP Bay Area to achieve a shared goal of a secure, single-site, long term facility in West Oakland to house the KIPP TK-8 program
- 6. Coordinating the <u>co-location</u> of the <u>Lafayette</u> and <u>West Oakland Middle</u> programs at a single site to support near-term TK-5 to 6-8 continuum at Lowell campus, as well as initiate a plan for resource sharing across programs beginning and during 2016-17
- 7. Facilitating <u>school-visits and Quality School Pillars workshops</u> within individual schools and at the Regional Committee Meetings, to begin seeding concepts of quality into the West Oakland Fall Call schools, in preparation for a 2016-17 design year
- 8. Designing and readying a <u>new (high support)</u> network structure to hold the West Oakland Call schools and their transformation process, (along with ISS and Spring Call sites) beginning in 2016-17; including RFQ process for <u>Strategic Partners</u> to support the new network and schools directly

Exploration Phase Fall 2015

- Up to 5 School Visits EACH (gather information on visits, attendance, participation)
- 20+ hours of Community building of W.O. leader (retreats and community of practice)
- \$7,000 EACH allocation for school visits, and planning
- 0.25 FTE dedicated to PLTW building teacher supports and tools, computers & device support, weekly best practice sharing (PK-5 expanded to PK-12)
- \$28K EACH for PLTW from Linked Learning (CPT grant) (field trips, classroom materials, technology)
- \$2,500K EACH teacher stipends (PK-8, through Math Dept)
- \$50K EACH Measure J technology, furnishing, digital signs (PK-8)
- \$40K allocated to West Oakland sites to increase 1:1 tech capacity





Letter of Intent Supports Winter 2016

- 2 hours of Orientations of Principals (Community of Practice)
- 2 hours of Engagement Planning for Staff proposal process and letter of intent
- 2 hours of Planning of polling staff interest in school improvement process
- 2 hours of Data collection & analysis training and Training of alignment to SPSA process
- 2 hours of Training on the SPF to identify data dives w/ community
- 2-3 Full Days EACH of Contracted Diana Sherman to provide 1:1 support on Site Planning
- 0.5 FTE SIP @ West Oakland Middle dedicated to support systems development (November -January)
- 5-10 Parent coffees EACH at WOMS / Lafayette w/ engagement team support

Proposal Phase Support Spring 2016

- 20 hours STEAM Rubric in development
- 20 hours Quality School Development Pillars Rubric in developments
- Ongoing schools visits
- \$5,500 EACH allocation for proposal planning
- 1 Day a week EACH Engagement Lead identified within EACH school or provided as needed to ensure communication, prep and documentation of engagement
- \$8K @ Hoover in Ed78 Design Cohort Phase I
- Up to 6-8 Events within Engagement Calendars EACH to be developed for spring
- Up to 6 hours of Events to support connecting w/ Former Designers
- Up to 8 hours of Consultancy / Tuning Protocols for proposal teams
- 25 hours of Differentiated Principal Institutes for W.O. Principals (monthly thru June)



West Oakland Call Supports

Design Phase Support 2016-17 and Ongoing 3-5 years

- \$150-\$225K EACH (based on size) to support Design Year
- \$100-\$200K EACH ongoing for 2 additional years to support implementation
- \$ Financial investments aligned to extended learning time for students (extended day / extended year if waiver approved)
- 20 hours a month of design coaching and support in Design Year
- At least 10 EACH coordinated schools visits in Design Year
- Access to 3-4 days a month of Common Core-aligned instructional Coaching & assessment planning for leader and ILT through provider
- 1.0 FTE Common Core Teacher Leader EACH to support instruction 15-16 & ongoing
