Vendor was selected because they are the on-site after school and summer programs provider. EBAYC has strong relationships with the school community, students and families. Additionally, as a youth development organization, EBAYC has an extensive track record implementing youth participatory action research curriculum with Oakland youth.

Summarize the services this Vendor will be providing.

This vendor will be working closely with the morning teacher to support a 19-day, 5 hour a day Summer Health Bridge Program for up to 25 youth. In the morning students will be learning about and practicing 21st century skills and in the afternoon students will explore community health issues that directly impact their communities. EBAYC will support groups of youth to identify a relevant health topic and create an action research project that will be presented out to students from other Summer Health Bridge programs, community members and local health care professionals. EBAYC will also support the coordination of 6 health speaker visits so that students may learn more about different health career options as well as facilitate one career exploration and one college visit.

Lead Agency Unit of Service

After School Services include:

After school program set up at school site and coordination of comprehensive services to ensure ASES and 21st Century grant compliance, alignment with school day, program quality, fiscal oversight, and compliance with district policies, including contracting processes, fiscal timelines, and Legal requirements.

Delivery of high quality after school programming consisting of academic, enrichment, and recreational/physical activity components to meet grant compliance. Services will be delivered by qualified, trained individuals and community providers with subject matter expertise and youth development experience.

After School program will serve up to 150 students at seven elementary school sites, 300 at the middle school site, and 135 at the high school site. Services will be offered daily, Monday through Friday, from September – June. Program will begin immediately at the end of the regular school day and will stay open until 6pm daily.

The After School Services include internship, homework assistance, math intervention, reading intervention, sport, culinary arts, science, visual and performing art instruction.

Program activities will be provided by qualified staff. Student to staff ratio will not exceed 20:1.

For High School Programs: services also include family literacy programming and equitable access services. The Family Literacy workshops engage parents in their children's academic and leadership development process, and college and career exploration.

Option A: services for up to 80 Elementary students: \$94,000

Option B: services for up to 115 Elementary students: \$135,000

Option C: services for up to 150 Elementary students: \$175,000

Option D: services for up to 165 Elementary students: \$195,000

Option E: services for up to 185 Middle School ASES students: \$200,000

Option F: services for up to 115 Middle School 21CCLCstudents: \$130,000

Option G: services for up to 135 High School students: \$233,000

Option H: services for up to 100 High School students: \$183,000

Dear Ms. Ma,

This letter explains the East Bay Asian Youth Center (EBAYC) policy for tuberculosis testing, fingerprinting and child abuse and neglect reporting.

EBAYC employees are not permitted to come into contact with students at any OUSD school sites until EBAYC receives their negative TB test results, fingerprint clearance and re-arrest records from the State of California - Department of Justice, and from the Federal Bureau of Investigation pursuant to Section 11105.3 of the California Penal Code and Section 15660 of the California Welfare and Institutions Code. No EBAYC employees who have been convicted of a violent or serious felony may come into contact with students.

EBAYC employees fully comply with the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act guidelines to report suspicions of possible child abuse and neglect to the appropriate reporting agencies.

Subject: Master Memorandum of Understanding between Oakland Unified School District and East Bay Asian Youth Center

Action Requested: Authorize the President and Secretary of the Board to enter into and execute a Memorandum of Understanding with East Bay Asian Youth Center, on behalf of the District to provide services to students. This establishes a one year Memorandum of Understanding with East Bay Asian Youth Center, and a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,000,000.00. This amount is not to exceed using historical cost data, known charges to the number of sites served and estimated available grant funding available.

Background: The Oakland Unified School District enters into contracts each year to provide professional services that support the District's academic mission. The Master MOU establishes all terms and conditions, a defined menu of services with negotiated rates, and allows for the governing of necessary supporting documentation to further streamline the process of resolving necessary questions or the keeping the process of checks and balances, as well as maintaining oversight by the governing board.

A Menu of Services was established that would allow a principal to "Order" from the Menu using the traditional Service Agreement (SA). This is essential to establish consistency of services, and the cost of those services, between the schools. Each individual Service Agreement is submitted to the Board for approval. In the event that this vendor receives more orders for services than anticipated, an amendment to the MOU will adjust a new not-to-exceed amount.

Discussion: Vendor: East Bay Asian Youth Center

Overview of Services: East Bay Asian Youth Center contracts with schools to be a lead agency to provide high quality after school programming consisting of academic enrichment and recreational, cultural activities, family literacy and assigned English as a Second Language services to students that are high risk.

Not-To-Exceed Amount: \$1,000,000.00

Determination of the Not-to-Exceed Amount is based on historical data and projections for the coming school year. It is anticipated that East Bay Asian Youth Center will provide services to 28 school sites.

The District contracts with agencies to provide various activities and after school programs. Chosen by the number of sites served with District and the long standing relationship with the agencies, the Master Memorandum of Understanding establishes a relationship with East Bay Asian Youth Center, defining terms and conditions as well as setting a maximum not-to-exceed ceiling amount. This ceiling is derived from historical cost data, and known changes in sites to be served, as well as expected grant funding. In addition, the District has been working with agencies to provide a Menu of Service, which delivers a clear and measurable scope of work. Analogous to ordering from a common table menu, each product is described and the price is clearly quoted, establishing and promoting a more perfect competition where the consumer, here the principal, is informed of the services offered, and the price for those services. This allows the principal to easily compare services and prices, and plan for programmatic needs.

Fiscal Impact

There is no funding associated with the Master Memorandum of Understanding or the Amendment to the Master Memorandum of Understanding herewith. The Master Memorandum of Understanding establishes a relationship, as well as setting the terms and conditions with East Bay Asian Youth Center. The funding source for each Individual Service Agreement will be determined separately and individually. Funding for the Individual Service Agreement is verified through a review of the BDT budget process, and a review of State and Federal compliance funding when applicable.

Recommendation

Approval of the Master MOU between East Bay Asian Youth Center and the Oakland Unified School District authorizing the President and Secretary of the Board to enter into and execute the Master Memorandum of Understanding and Individual Service Agreement(s) with East Bay Asian Youth Center in an amount not-to-exceed \$3,003,240.00.

**MASTER MEMORANDUM OF
UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT and
East Bay Asian Youth Center**

2015-2016

1. INTENT

- 1.1 Intent of this Memorandum of Understanding. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes the Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) intent to establish a relationship with East Bay Asian Youth Center. The OUSD CONTRACTOR shall provide services to OUSD as described and agreed to in the individual Service Agreements.

Contractor's Amount of SPAN: NOT TO EXCEED \$ 1,000,000.00

- 1.2 This Master MOU shall include an individual Services Agreement (ISA) completed for each OUSD site OUSD CONTRACTOR is to provide services. It is understood that this Master MOU does not commit OUSD to pay for services provided by any OUSD CONTRACTOR, unless and until an authorized OUSD representative approves the terms, and a Purchase Order is issued by OUSD's procurement department and the ISA(s) are ratified by the Board of Education.

2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 2.1 Term of Agreement. The term of this agreement shall be July 1, 2015 to August 31, 2016 and may be extended by written agreement of both parties. ISAs are void upon termination or expiration of this Master MOU.
- 2.2 All terms and conditions apply fully and severally to all CONTRACTOR'S equipment, reports, personnel, subcontractors, and/or subcontract agreements, and by the direction of CONTRACTOR.
- 2.3 Notice of Termination. OUSD may at any time, terminate this agreement about not less than thirty (30) days written notice to CONTRACTOR. OUSD shall compensate CONTRACTOR for services actually provided through the date of termination. In addition, OUSD may terminate this agreement for cause should CONTRACTOR fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of termination for cause, OUSD may replace the required services from another contractor. If removal is OUSD records the cost of providing the services pursuant to this Agreement, OUSD PAYMENT shall pay the additional cost.
- 2.4 Choice of Law. This Agreement shall be performed in Oakland, CA, and is governed by the laws of the State of California.
- 2.5 Licenses and Permits. CONTRACTOR shall obtain and keep in force all licenses, permits, and certificates necessary for the performance of this Agreement.
- 2.6 Confidentiality. This Agreement and all agreements and documents in any way connected to this Agreement, and all confidential information shall be construed as one document.
- 2.7 Conflict of Interest. CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, rules and/or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any officer or employee of OUSD to perform any service by this Agreement without first obtaining the written approval of OUSD. CONTRACTOR affirms in the best of his/her knowledge, there exists no actual or potential conflict of interest between CONTRACTOR'S family, business or financial interest and the services provided under this Agreement, and in the event of change in self or potential conflict of interest under this Agreement, any question regarding possible conflict of interest shall be sent as a report of such change will be brought to OUSD's attention in writing.

- 2.8 **Drug-Free / Smoke Free Policy.** No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any building and/or grounds on OUSD property. No tobacco, e-cigs, vaping, COMBUSTIBLES or substitution and to use drugs on their sites.
- 2.9 **Anti-Discrimination.** Consistent with the policy of OUSD in connection with all work performed under Contract, CONTRACTOR shall not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of actual or perceived race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sexual orientation, gender, sex or sexual orientation. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws existing, but not limited to, the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 12940 and OUSD policy. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to require the compliance by all its employees(s).
- 2.10 **Local, Small Local and Small Local Resident Business Enterprise Program (LSEARLBP).** OUSD has a 8 percent (8%) contract local participation goal as set for all professional advisory contracts over the annual (July 1 - December 31) date (Contract Code Section 55119). Contractors shall comply with the twenty percent (20%) local business and operation requirement at a rate of ten percent (10%) local and 10% small local residents of local source of business as follows: OUSD requires to be certified by the City of Oakland in order to earn credit toward meeting the twenty percent participation requirement. A copy of the District SBE/SLPCE Policy can be obtained from the OUSD website: www.ousd.k12.ca.us
- 2.11 **Limitation of OUSD Liability.** Other than as provided in this Agreement, OUSD's greatest obligation under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall OUSD be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, or on specific, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenues, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.
- 2.12 **CONTRACTOR exists as expenses.** OUSD shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for OUSD except as follows:
 a. In all provided not be exceed \$ 1000
- 2.13 **Liability of CONTRACTOR to correct unsatisfactory work.** The granting of any payment by OUSD, or the work performed by CONTRACTOR, shall in no way lessen the liability of CONTRACTOR to correct unsatisfactory work, although the unsatisfactory character of that work may not have been apparent or detected at the time a payment was made. 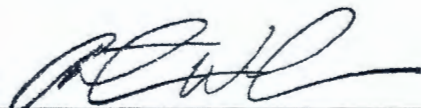
