**Subject:** Review and approval by the Board of Education to submit the Consolidated Application and Reporting System (CARS) 2016-17 Application for Funding

**Action Requested:** Review and approve the District's submission of the CARS 2016-17 Application for Funding through the Consolidated Application system for Title I, II and III funds.

**Background:** The District is required to annually submit an "Application for Funding" through the Consolidated Application system to receive federal categorical funds. As a part of this process, the Board of Education is asked to review and approve the state required forms attached to this application. These include the preliminary "2016-17 Title I Part A Planned School Allocations" form which lists all Title I eligible Oakland Unified schools with enrollment and percentage Free or Reduced Price Meals participation. Also attached is the "2016-17 Title I, Part A Nonprofit Private School Participation" for private schools in Oakland participating in these programs. Charter schools are independently funded from the district. For fiscal year 2016-2017 the federal funding requested is indicated in the chart below. Actual funding for all Titles is based on the percentage of students qualifying for Free or Reduced Price Meals.






