## **Healthy Recess for Oakland Kids and Families**

The OUSD Healthy Recess Program will train up to 40 school staff in an evidence-based curriculum proven to increase physical activity and reduce incidents of bullying. We will implement this program at 10 elementary schools with the lowest fitness scores and fewest resources—reaching approximately 2,000 children during the 2016-2017 school year. In addition, the program will support each of the 10 schools in implementing at least 2 Healthy Recess Family Events throughout the school year.

Each of the 10 elementary schools will identify one staff member to be trained as a Healthy Recess Wellness Champion (for more information on the OUSD award winning Wellness Champion program, click <u>here</u>). Recess Champions and 1 to 3 other staff members will attend a two-day intensive workshop, led by Playworks Northern California. This training will give Recess Champions tools to lead structured, inclusive, and healthy play activities on their campuses that have been proven to develop positive social behaviors in children. Curriculum topics include:

- Playground games that teach conflict resolution, cooperation, and other critical social and emotional skills.
- Group management strategies that set students up for successful group behavior.
- Developing and maintaining a recess plan to maintain a healthy recess environment and continuously improve recess and student behavior.

After the training, Playworks staff will provide onsite observation and 1:1 consultation. All Recess Champions will join the OUSD team of Wellness Champions, which work together on each school Site Wellness Council.

Each of the 10 schools will also identify a Parent Healthy Recess Wellness Coordinator to organize the family events. They will have access to a variety of resources offered by OUSD and its partners, such as Playworks Play Day materials, nutrition education materials and interactive displays, the OUSD bike blender and more. The schools will also receive sustainable wellness supplies (such as jump ropes) to use at the events and beyond.

**Evaluation Activities include:** 

- Activity logs completed by the Healthy Recess Wellness Champions and Healthy Recess Parent Wellness Coordinators
- School-wide staff surveys around program implementation and impact
- Month-long physical activity tracking by representative students at the 10 schools
- Healthy behavior tally at the family recess wellness events
