- B. Ensure that all CONTRACTOR personnel, including subcontractors, will comply with any policy and systems in place at OUSD and School(s). This includes, but is not limited to the following:
 - 1. **Drug and Smoke Free**—No drugs, alcohol, and/or smoking are allowed at any time in any buildings and/or grounds on OUSD property. No students, staff, visitors, CONTRACTORS, or subcontractors are to use drugs on these School(s).
 - 2. Anti-Discrimination—It is the policy of OUSD that in connection with CONTRACTOR's services in this MOU there shall be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work because of race, color,

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ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, or age. Therefore, the CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws.

- 3. Conflict of Interest—CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any OUSD employee to perform the services in this MOU, and affirms that to the best of its knowledge no such conflict presently exists. CONTRACTOR agrees to alert OUSD in writing if and when a potential conflict does arise.
- 4. Family Education Rights and Privacy Act—CONTRACTOR shall observe District policies and regulations, and state and federal laws, including the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, related to the confidentiality of pupil and personnel records.
- C. Required Documents—Ensure that all CONTRACTOR personnel who will be on OUSD premises have been: (a) fingerprinted; (b) submitted to DOJ and FBI criminal background check via Live Scan or a similar service as required by the Education Code, and (c) taken a tuberculosis test. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.

D. Insurance

- 1. General Liability: EITHER (a) Provide evidence of general liability insurance that names OUSD as an additional insured, for operations, students, volunteers, and personnel at location where CONTRACTOR provides programs/services with at least \$1 Million in coverage, and furnish certificate of said insurance to OUSD OR (b) CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain insurance under this agreement if the Risk Management Officer signs a waiver of insurance. The additional insured address must read: Oakland Unified School District, Attention: Risk Management, 1000 Broadway Suite 440, Oakland, CA 94607. Waiver of insurance does not release CONTRACTOR from responsibility for any claim or demand.
- 2. Workers' Compensation: If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this MOU, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and federal laws, when applicable. The CONTRACTORS' Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease.

- E. Communication—Communicate with School(s) and OUSD staff, both formally and informally, to ensure, to the best of the program's ability, that the CONTRACTOR'S services are aligned with the School(s) and OUSD's mission and objectives and are adequately meeting student's needs. At the request of School(s) or OUSD staff, provide reasonable data and information to students participating in the CONTRACTOR's program.
- F. Confidentiality—CONTRACTOR shall maintain strict confidentiality of all information about individual students received under this MOU and will not disseminate such information without the express written consent of OUSD. CONTRACTOR will comply with FERPA, and will be allowed to use the data received to solicit funding to continue to expand its services/program, so long as there is no information from which the identity of any student in the CONTRACTOR's program as a participant could be made.
- G. Register With/Update Community Partner Platform—Contractor shall register in OUSD's Community Partner Platform (CPP) database and perform annual updates by August 31 of each year, to maintain full and complete up-to-date information. The CPP database and instructions may be found online at ousd.org under Partner Organizations.

IV. Required Documents

CONTRACTOR CANNOT commence the services agreed to in this MOU until it has submitted the following documents:

A. Contractor (Individual):

- C. **Data**—Ensure that CONTRACTOR has reasonable access to student assessment and evaluation data necessary to inform instruction and periodically review student progress and to provide the study.
 - 1. For the purpose of cohort determination, for instructional purposes, or for academic research purposes, at the sole discretion of OUSD, provide CONTRACTOR access to student assessment data for all students at School(s) including, but not limited to, state test scores and site-based assessments. Students identified may be protected by the use of ID numbers.
 - 2. Provide CONTRACTOR with any other student information reasonably necessary to provide its services consistent with the CONTRACTOR's program and to evaluate the impact of its program on students at School(s).

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VI. Duration

4) Scope of Work: A 1-page description of services to be provided and expected outcomes

Through our Global Healing and Human Rights Training Program, PTR provides graduate and doctoral level trainees in clinical social work and psychology in-depth case supervision and a tailored training curriculum to foster a comprehensive understanding of the psychosocial impacts of human rights abuses as well as skilled capacity for helping survivors heal. Our graduate and doctoral level trainees are able to use the skills they cultivate to address the experiences of emotional distress specific to refugee and asylum seeking populations through trauma-informed, culturally adapted mental health services. Through our partnership with the Oakland Unified School District, PTR will be able to provide students at Oakland International High School who identify with the previously mentioned distresses with culturally-aware, trauma-informed psychosocial support.

We provide culturally-aware, trauma-informed psychosocial care to students at OIHS who have experienced emotional distress related to human rights concerns. Graduate level clinical trainees in psychology and social work will be placed onsite at Oakland international High School two days a week to see students primarily for individual psychological support. They will work with Lauren Markham, the OIHS Community School Program Manager alongside the Coordination of Services Team (COST) to determine which and how many students they will meet with for counseling and to determine an appropriate schedule. Our doctoral trainees will work closely with the COST team to ensure students are receiving sufficient support and may also help with case management, home visits and family meetings as needed. They have unique international backgrounds and language skills that allow them to offer culturally aware and linguistically accessible psychosocial care to the OIHS student community.

Thanks to counseling and other interventions described above Oakland International High School students working with our PTR doctoral trainee will show improvement in their emotional wellbeing, school performance, peer relationships and overall social integration. Research increasingly demonstrates that when trauma-informed, culturally adapted approaches for healing trauma are provided, recovery is possible. Using interventions tailored to a student's needs and capacities and relevant in their cultural contexts enables them to speak about traumatic experiences, directly address their emotional and physical symptoms of depression, anxiety, and PTSD and acquire skills to manage and reduce their distress. Unnecessary suffering can be averted and more severe emotional and social problems can be prevented. Students can begin to live healthy and productive lives, ultimately benefitting their families and surrounding communities.

Using establish program evaluation and monitoring tools, PTR will measure Oakland International High School student well-being and emotional state at the beginning of services and upon conclusion of services to determine changes in mental health status. PTR will also implement periodic six month surveys to receive feedback from students and determine where relevant, areas where services can be improved. PTR will use this information to continuously enhance and ensure successful delivery of mental health care to the Oakland International High School student community.

PTR is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to healing trauma among international survivors of human rights abuses. PTR joins the movement to reduce the global mental health gap by addressing the psychosocial impacts of trauma caused by war, torture, forced displacement, human trafficking, and persecution due to identity and beliefs. We draw on synergies among the core components of our model to: (a) Provide culturally aware, trauma-informed and linguistically accessible mental health care for refugees, asylees, asylum seekers and human trafficking survivors, (b) Expand clinical capacity to serve these populations, and (c) Advocate for policies to prevent trauma and re-traumatization.

As a recently established organization we do not yet have client outcomes to report on. Our program includes the following resources to provide culturally aware, trauma-informed and linguistically accessible psychosocial services to international survivors of human rights abuses.

Experienced Staff: Our multidisciplinary clinical team is composed of thirteen clinicians dedicated to providing trauma-informed, culturally-aware mental health care for international survivors of human rights abuses, and contributing to the psychosocial wellbeing of refugee and asylum seeking populations. With combined expertise gained through over twenty years of indepth experience providing clinical services to survivors of war trauma, torture and persecution our team integrates the fields of global mental health and human rights to assess needs, implement appropriate therapeutic approaches and increase the depth of psychosocial support for these highly vulnerable populations.

Language Capacity: PTR additionally has a team of mental health interpreters who enable us to provide linguistically accessible care for clients from all cultural, ethnic and linguistic groups. Our team of interpreters speak over eight languages including Spanish, French, Farsi, Dari, Tigrinya, Amharic, Mam, Pashto and Arabic. Together with the linguistic capabilities of our clinical staff, PTR is able to provide services in twenty languages. The PTR doctoral student who will be working with OIHS speaks Arabic and French.

Specialized Training: Through our partnerships with local academic institutions, our graduate and doctoral level trainees in clinical social work and psychology develop a comprehensive understanding of the psychosocial impacts of human rights abuses, as well as skilled capacity for helping survivors heal through in-depth case supervision and a tailored training curriculum. Trainees cover a variety of relevant topics including refugee and asylee trauma; forced displacement and exile; grief and loss; sensitive assessment and treatment planning; working with victims of torture; collaborating with interpreters; and global cultural awareness. With this training, our globally-minded clinicians are prepared to serve international survivors of human rights abuses, refugees and asylum seekers at Oakland International High School.

Program evaluation: PTR recognizes the critical role of measuring progress, obtaining feedback and adapting therapeutic approaches to client needs and responses, and has implemented a monitoring and evaluation system to enhance our outcomes. PTR uses this evaluation system to document the efficacy of our work, and share this insight with potential program partners to expand the availability of healing services for these populations.
