PURPOSE OF THIS GRANT

To support math improvement in Oakland Unified Middle Schools.

STEPS YOU WILL TAKE TO ACHIEVE YOUR RESULTS

Three middle schools with highly intensive supports will hire a Common Core Teacher Leader for STEM (CCTL-STEM) focused on math and computer science. The role of the CCTL is to build the instructional capacity of a team of teachers to prepare students to higher standards. CCTLs coach their colleagues in their classrooms, but also facilitate professional collaboration and learning. 40% of the CCTL role is to support students with high need directly.

Blueprint is a high-dosage tutoring program proven to accelerate mathematics achievement through individualized, standardsbased academic support in a small-group setting. Math Fellows work with a maximum of four students per session, allowing individualized instruction and purposefully addressing gaps in foundational mathematics knowledge while building students' ability to problem solve and think critically. The instruction students receive is supplemental and connected to what students are learning in their primary core math class.

WHAT WILL CHANGE AS A RESULT OF YOUR PROJECT

Teachers will have time and support to grow and improve to meet the twin challenges of teaching new content while teaching so that all students (regardless of learning level) can accelerate to the higher levels of new standards.

Dramatically increased student success in mathematics, as evidenced by multiple measures, including the rate of students earning As, Bs, and Cs in their core math class at participating middle and high schools.

SECTION 4: GRANT AGREEMENT

This grant was solicited using the 501(c)(3) designation of the Oakland Public Education Fund (the Ed Fund). Therefore, the Ed Fund is obligated to serve as the fiscal sponsor for theses funds and as such has a unique role in ensuring that these charitable funds are expended in ways that align with applicable state and federal laws, I.R.S. Codes, and, if applicable, original funder intent.

This Grant Agreement contains the terms and conditions for Grant#16-09-01891228 in the amount of \$590,000.00 from The Oakland Public Education Fund (Ed Fund) to Oakland Unified School District (the Grantee). By signing this Grant Agreement and accepting grant funds, an authorized representative of the Grantee agrees to the following obligations and conditions:



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- 1. If not already on file, grantee shall provide the Ed Fund with its governing documents, a completed and filed IRS Form SS-4 or other documentation satisfactory to the Ed Fund, showing Grantee's separate existence as an organization.
- 2. Grantee shall use the grant solely for the project described in the accompanying cover letter, and Grantee shall repay to the Ed Fund any portion of the amount granted which is not used for that project. Any changes in the purpose for which grant funds are spent must be approved in writing by the Ed Fund before implementation. the Ed Fund retains the right, if Grantee breaches this Agreement, or if Grantee's conduct of the project jeopardizes the Ed Fund's legal or tax status, to withhold, withdraw, or demand immediate return of grant funds, and to spend such funds so as to accomplish the purposes of the project as nearly as possible within the Ed Fund's sole judgment. Any tangible or intangible property, including copyrights, obtained or created by Grantee as part of this project shall remain the property of Grantee.
- 3. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute the naming of Grantee as an agent or legal representative of the Ed Fund for any purpose whatsoever except as specifically and to the extent set forth herein. This Agreement shall not be deemed to create any relationship of agency, partnership, or joint venture between the parties hereto, and Grantee shall make no such representation to anyone.
- 4. Grantee shall submit full and complete reports to the Ed Fund in compliance with the schedule presented in the letter accompanying this agreement. The report shall describe the charitable programs conducted by the Grantee with the aid of this grant and the expenditures made with grant funds, and shall report on the Grantee's compliance with the terms of this grant.
- 5. Grantee shall ensure that the Ed Fund is included in any communications connected with the grant including press releases, programs, announcements, invitations, stories in the media, annual reports, and newsletters. Grantee will submit copies of any such publication with project report(s).
- 6. This grant is not to be used in any attempt to influence legislation within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(c)(3). No agreement, oral or written, to that effect has been made between the Ed Fund and Grantee.
- 7. Grantee shall not use any portion of the funds granted herein to participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office, to induce or encourage violations of law or public policy, to cause any private inurement or improper private benefit to occur, nor to take any other action inconsistent with IRC Section 501(c)(3).
- 8. Grantee shall notify the Ed Fund immediately of any change in (a) Grantee's legal or tax status, and (b) Grantee's executive or key staff responsible for achieving the grant purposes.
- 9. In the event of any controversy, claim, or dispute between the parties arising out of or related to this Agreement, or the alleged breach thereof, shall be determined by arbitration in Alameda County, CA, before one arbitrator. The arbitration shall be administered by Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services (JAMS) pursuant to its Streamlined Arbitration Rules and Procedures. Judgment on the award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. This clause shall not preclude parties from seeking provisional remedies in aid of arbitration from a court of appropriate jurisdiction. The prevailing party shall, in addition to any other relief, be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of sustaining its position. Each provision of this Agreement shall be separately enforceable, and the invalidity of one provision shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California applicable to contracts to be performed entirely within such State. Time is of the essence of this Agreement and of each and every provision hereof. The failure of the Ed Fund to exercise any of its rights under this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such rights.
- 10. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California applicable to agreements made and to be performed entirely within such State.
