2017-2020: NEW CA. Template

What can we expect from the new California LCAP Template?

- The intent is to simplify the LCAP process for staff and families.
- New template makes it easier for a parent or community member to understand the district targeted investment in services for unduplicated pupils:
 - Free & Reduced Lunch Students
 - Foster Youth
 - English Language Learners





- OUSD has included MORE of our entire budget than any other district in Alameda County (65%).
- This "fiscal transparency" has been held up as an exemplar in other districts.
- Staff spent DAYS of time creating the LCAP to include the additional investments (Title I, Title II, III, etc.) and went back and forth with ACOE on several investments, resulting in multiple revisions, staff working around the clock and an added Board meeting in June of 2016.
- It has also resulted in an LCAP that is 500+ pages long and is for the average consumer "unwieldy".
- This year signals the shift to a new template, so we are recommending a shift in our approach with LCAP.

PSAC is an "Advisory" body so will not be voting tonight, but instead giving feedback on the proposed change. The decision will be made by the Superintendent with guidance from **County and State**

NEW TEMPLATE: NEW PROPOSAL:

- Include ONLY Supplemental & Concentration funding investments by goal area in the official LCAP submitted to ACOE
 - Create an interactive LCAP (see West Contra Costa's).
 - Provide additional investment detail in the Appendix spreadsheet provided.

Benefits to New Approach



How will the new approach help our families understand our "district story" and return on investments? Easier to READ and understand investment for targeted groups (LI, FY, ELL). Better use of staff time, given budget reductions in central office.

Gives Alameda County and State of CA what they are asking for and not MORE.

Less room for error.

Enables staff to produce an LCAP with time for Board and community to study and make comments within the scheduled Board meetings.

By isolation S/C funding, it is easier to draw conclusions to student outcomes, as required in LCAP.
