Overarching Vision for G1 Funds

How are G1 funds being used to give better access to arts, world languages, and music at your school site? Westlake Measure G1 funding \$79,919-

- .80 FTE funding for a Drama teacher (.80 FTE = \$66,000)
- .80 FTE funding for a Choir/Dance teacher (.80 FTE = \$66,000, however \$13,919 will be paid using Measure G1)

How will these dollars accelerate the outcomes for your students and help them reach the targets laid out in the school's vision?

Our Vision reinforces fostering creativity through offering a robust elective curriculum. Through increasing Arts electives and Arts integrated curriculum in core academics, we expect the overall outcomes of our scholars to improve.

- Master schedule configuration to ensure scholars have access to at least 3 of the abovereferenced electives

Measure G1

- City of Oakland taxpayer approved in November to support Middle School electives and employee retention.
- Our anticipated budget \$140,000 for the next 10 years
- Must <u>supplement</u> elective offerings

Discussion

- We strive to be an Arts based school, electives here need to focus on Arts
- We should also consider languages- maybe Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, French, American Sign Language, others?
- What about computers? Students need to be ready for technology especially in the Bay Area. Many students will go to college and have careers in tech, so we need to introduce them to that. Maybe the computer class can have an Arts content to it to support Arts
- \$140,000 can't pay for all these teachers, we may need to use other budget sources to pay for positions. What about supplies? How will supplies be paid for these new programs? We can use site funds for supplies but teachers really need to self-find their program like Art & Music with Ms. Houston and Mr. Porter. Maybe if we can't afford full-time teachers, we can hire part-time, or maybe hire Art consultants to work with the kids.
