Subject Amendment to Board Policy – BP 6178.1 Work-Based Learning

**Action Requested** Approval by the Board of Education of updates to the Oakland Unified

School District Board Policy BP 6178.1 Work-Based Learning

**Background** Periodically modifications to board policies are recommended to align with

changes in law or recommended best practices. The proposed modifications to the board policies reflect the District's standards.

**Discussion** In order to ensure that our policies are current, it is important for us to

review and update our policies. The proposed changes are based upon the California Association of Schools Board's recommended model. The modifications have been reviewed and vetted by the General Counsel.

This policy was updated to add material regarding board approval of any district plan for work-based learning. It was also updated to reflect the new law (AB 2063), which authorizes the District to grant credit for satisfactory completion of work experience education program to students ages 14 and 15 with the certification of the principal.

The changes to the policy are shown on the attachment. The proposed deletions are indicated with blue strikeouts. The recommended additions

are shown in red.

BP 6178.1

Work Experience Education Based Learning

<u>The In order Governing Board desires</u> to <u>provide students facilitate work-based learning</u> opportunities which link classroom learning with <u>valuable instruction in real-world experiences</u>. The district's work-based learning program shall be designed to teach students the skills, attitudes, and <u>understandings knowledge</u> necessary for successful employment and to reinforce mastery of both academic and career technical education (CTE) standards.

The district's work-based learning program may offer opportunities for paid and/or unpaid work experiences, including, but not limited to:

- 1. Work experience education as defined in Education Code 51764
- 2. Cooperative CTE or community classrooms as defined in Education Code 52372.1
- 3. Job shadowing experience as defined in Education Code 51769
- 4. Student internships
- 5. Apprenticeships
- 6. Service learning
- 7. Employment in social/civic or school-based enterprises
- 8. Technology-based or other simulated work experiences

The Superintendent or designee may provide students employment opportunities with public and private employers in areas within or outside the Governing Board shall offer a program of work experience education. Students enrolled in this program district, including in any contiguous state. (Education Code 51768)

Any district plan for work-based learning shall receive be submitted to the Board for approval. When required, the plan shall be submitted to the California Department of Education or other state agency or official.

The Superintendent or designee shall involve local businesses or business organizations in planning and implementing work-based learning opportunities that support the district's vision and goals for student learning and local workforce development efforts. He/she also may work with postsecondary institutions, community organizations, and others to identify opportunities for work-based learning.

When required by law, the Superintendent or designee shall develop a written training agreement with the employer that describes the conditions and requirements to be met by all parties and shall develop an individual training plan for each student which outlines the objectives or competencies that the student is expected to accomplish at the work site. (5 CCR 10070-10071, 10087, 10108)

To ensure appropriate guidance and supervision designed to ensure maximum of participating students and maximize the educational benefit from placement in suitable work experience education courses any work-based learning program, district staff shall coordinate with the workplace supervisors or mentors.

Work experience education shall include the part-time be allowed employment of students in jobs which are selected or approved as having educational value for the employed students and which are coordinated by school employees. (Education Code 51764)

The Board may provide for liability insurance for students participating in work experience programs of study off school grounds based learning program only if he/she has been issued a work permit, in accordance with law and, Board policy, and administrative regulation. (Education Code 5176049113, 49160)

All laws or rules applicable to minors in employment relationships shall be applicable to students enrolled in work-based learning programs. (Education Code 51763)

<u>The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that any teacher-coordinator of a work-based learning program possesses the appropriate credential issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing.</u> (5 CCR 10075, 10080, 10100)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain records related to each student's participation in the district's work-based learning program, including, but not limited to, the student's individualized training plan, employment hours and job site, work permit if applicable, the employer's report of student's attendance and job performance, the teacher-coordinator's consultations and observations, and reports of the student's grade and credits earned.

Work-Based Learning

The Governing Board desires to facilitate work-based learning opportunities which link classroom learning with real-world experiences. The district's work-based learning program shall be designed to teach students the skills, attitudes, and knowledge necessary for successful employment and to reinforce mastery of both academic and career technical education (CTE) standards.

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To ensure appropriate guidance and supervision of participating students and maximize the educational benefit from placement in any work-based learning program, district staff shall coordinate with the workplace supervisors or mentors.

A minor student shall be allowed employment through a paid work-based learning program only if he/she has been issued a work permit, in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation. (Education Code 49113, 49160)
