- 1. Ms. Dori called the meeting to order, some members are late
- Financials were discussed 10k reserve and goal to secure sports transportation. Outside donors have contributed funds. Discussion around graduation tickets was brought up.
- 3. Ms. Dori announced she will not be returning next year. She will be focusing on her family. The suggestions was made for Ms. Perez and Ms. G to run the parent club. Ms. Perez will be very valuable as a native Spanish speaker. The goal is to encourage more Spanish speaking parents for the upcoming school year.
- 4. Calendar of Events <u>all events have been tabled</u> due to low attendance. The parent club will review possible dates with the events and activities coordinator and student council. Ms. Dori will meet with admin during the in-service meetings to discuss possible changes and tentative dates.
 - a. Mr. Wienclawski provided an update on LCAP/WASC/Renewal recently approved LCAP for 2017-20 and WASC preliminary approval was mentioned. BayTech anticipates accreditation for another 6 years. Renewal is going well. A renewal team was created to project a timeline and create an early performance guideline for OUSD. Parent involvement is critical for all areas. The group discussed ways to improve participation. Mr. Wienclawski suggested Tuesday coffee with the Vice Principal as a possible avenue for engagement.
- 5. **Fundraising was tabled** because Ingrid and Alretta were not present. Will be updated in the next parent club meeting.
- 6. Measure G1 a new measure for grades 6-8 to gain access to arts/music/language programs. All participants approved the application, but were notified an application template was not available yet. Parents expressed hiring a third party vendor who offers arts and activities to continue BayTech's vision of providing a holistic educational program. A movement toward STEAM might be possible pending renewal and discussions for the next 10 years.
