### ARTICLE III

#### MEMBERSHIP

##### Section 1:

There shall be four official parent voting representatives from each electoral district. The four representatives shall include one to two English Learner parent representatives, based on the English Learner student demographic of each district. The representatives shall be called LCAP PSAC Delegates and are elected at-large by their respective School Site Council (SSC) parent members and Site English Language Learners' Sub-Committees (SELLS) from their electoral districts as indicated in Section 2c. There shall be 9 official student voting representatives, one from each electoral district, and 2 student directors. Students will be elected during the All City Council student elections.

##### Section 2

a. There shall be SSC parent member voting representatives from 60% of the schools per district to conduct an electoral district election. District-wide nominations for membership to the LCAP PSAC will be held at the October meeting of each academic year. Nominees must attend the December meeting of the LCAP PSAC to be eligible for election. The election of nominees for membership that begins in February of said academic year will be conducted in a January public meeting by staff assigned to support the LCAP PSAC, utilizing write-in ballots. The voting rolls can remain open for an additional public meeting as needed to support wider participation by delegates and the establishment of quorum from schools in each electoral district.

b. When a quorum of schools is not reached after an additional vote happens at a public meeting, nominees can be elected at a subsequent meeting of the LCAP PSAC by eligible parent members from their respective electoral districts with a simple majority of current LCAP PSAC members, the required quorum for regular LCAP PSAC meetings. Members elected in this way can serve until the next district-wide LCAP PSAC elections.

c. Members from Site English Language Learners' Sub-Committees (SELLS) can count for up to half of the 60% quorum of schools that is required to hold the January district-wide elections, can be nominated to the English Language Learner (ELL) seats in their electoral districts, and can vote to elect members to the ELL seats.
