

















How we perform

89% high school graduation rate (measured by 4-year cohort)


84% of Aspire alumni still enrolled in college

college graduation rate versus national average for low-income students




ASPIRE GSP SURPASSES STATE AND LOCAL DISTRICTS IN A-G COMPLETION RATES
