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SECTION 2: GRANT PURPOSE AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES

It is mutually understood that this grant is awarded with the expectation that the Grantee will expend the entire amount to address the following agreed-upon purpose and objectives. While minor changes in plan are expected, prior written approval of Educate78 is required to use the funds in a way that is fundamentally different from the stated intentions of the grant. It is the responsibility of the Grantee to ensure that its use of funds conforms with the purpose and objectives of the grant or to seek approval for a change.

PURPOSE OF THIS GRANT

This grant has been provided to advance the mission of Alliance Academy in the following ways:

• Alliance teachers will receive coaching and professional development from Alameda County Office of Education School Transformation Through the Arts (STTArts) staff to increase teacher efficacy, satisfaction, and retention.

WHAT WILL CHANGE AS A RESULT

- Teacher retention will increase 11 percentage points from 72% in 17-18 to 83% in 18-19.
- 80% of Alliance teachers will "agree" or "strongly agree" with Q1-4 statements on the Gallup Q12 engagement survey.
- 80% of Alliance teachers will be satisfied with the effectiveness of STTArts affinity learning communities and coaching as measured by evaluation tool developed by STTArts and Alliance's Instructional Leadership Team.
- At least 80% of Alliance teachers will meet their professional learning goal developed with their coach and tied to the district evaluation system and STTArts integrated learning frameworks.

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SECTION 4: GENERAL PROVISIONS

This Grant Agreement contains the terms and conditions for Alliance-0622 in the amount of \$10,000 from Educate78 to Alliance Academy (the Grantee). By signing this Grant Agreement and accepting grant funds, an officer, director, or trustee of the Grantee agrees to the obligations and conditions, and makes the representations set forth below.

- a. The Grantee confirms that it retains full discretion and control over the process of selecting any persons or organizations (researchers, employees, independent contractors, secondary grantees, conference participants, consultants, vendors, or suppliers) or any equipment, supplies, or products, to carry out the purposes of this grant, completely independently of Educate78. The Grantee confirms that there is no agreement, either written or oral, that Educate78 can cause the selection of particular persons or organizations or direct the use of grant funds for any particular expenditure.
- b. Educate78 makes grants using funds from a variety of foundations and individuals, and at its sole discretion has selected the Grantee to receive this grant. Grantee may not make any statement, or otherwise imply to the media, the general public or any other donor or investor that Grantee is supported by any donor other than Educate78, unless your organization has directly received funds from that donor.
- c. Grantee shall use the funds solely for the project described in Section 2 of this Grant Agreement, and Grantee shall repay to Educate78 any portion of the amount granted which is not used for that project. Any changes in the purpose for which grant funds are to be spent must be approved in writing by Educate78 before implementation of those changes and expending funds on those changes. Educate78 retains the right, if Grantee breaches this Agreement, or if Grantee's conduct of the project jeopardizes Educate78's legal or tax status, to withhold, withdraw, or demand immediate return of grant funds, and to spend such funds so as to accomplish the purposes of the project as nearly as possible within Educate78's sole judgment. Any tangible or intangible property, including copyrights, obtained or created by Grantee as part of this project shall remain the property of Grantee.
- d. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute the naming of Grantee as an agent or legal representative of Educate78 for any purpose whatsoever except as specifically and to the extent set forth herein. This Agreement shall not be deemed to create any relationship of agency, partnership, or joint venture between the parties hereto, and Grantee shall not represent to anyone that it is the agent, legal representative of, partner, or joint venture of Educate78.
- e. Grantee shall submit full and complete reports to Educate78 in compliance with the schedule stated in Section 3 of this Grant Agreement. The report shall describe the charitable and educational programs conducted by the Grantee with the aid of this grant and the expenditures made with grant funds, and shall report on the Grantee's compliance with the terms of this grant.
- f. Grantee understands that Educate78's obligation to disburse funds to Grantee as outlined above in Section 3 is contingent upon and shall not arise until Grantee completes the required milestones and reporting obligations stated in Section 3. Grantee further confirms and agrees that if Grantee fails to complete any milestone or reporting requirement within 12 months of the date indicated in the schedule in Section 3, all of Educate78's obligations to disburse any remaining grant funds shall lapse and Grantee shall lose any right to further funding under this Agreement even if Grantee later completes the required milestone or reporting requirement. In such an event, Grantee may reapply for Grant funding and Educate78, at its sole discretion, may enter into a new grant agreement with Grantee.
- g. Grantee shall inform its Board, staff, parents, community partners and other relevant stakeholders of Educate78's grant, engaging Educate78 for support in promotion. This may be done through a variety of approaches, including press release, newsletter, logo on the website, social media post, physical banner or other signage. Educate78 will provide a digital copy of its logo for this use and can support development of joint promotional materials. Grantee is encouraged to include Educate78 as a supporter in annual reports, presentations, and proposals.
- h. This grant is not to be used in any attempt to influence legislation within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(c)(3). Grantee shall not use any portion of the funds granted herein to participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office, to induce or encourage violations of law or public policy, to cause any private inurement or improper private benefit to occur, nor to take



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any other action inconsistent with IRC Section 501(c)(3). No agreement, oral or written, to that effect has been made between Educate 78 and Grantee.

- i. Grantee shall notify Educate78 immediately of any change in (a) Grantee's legal or tax status, and (b) Grantee's executive or key staff responsible for achieving the grant purposes.
- j. In the event of any controversy, claim, or dispute between the parties arising out of or related to this Agreement, or the alleged breach thereof, shall be determined by arbitration in Alameda County, California, before one arbitrator. The arbitration shall be administered by Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services (JAMS) pursuant to its Streamlined Arbitration Rules and Procedures. Judgment on the award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. This clause shall not preclude parties from seeking provisional remedies in aid of arbitration from a court of appropriate jurisdiction. The prevailing party shall, in addition to any other relief, be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of sustaining its position. Each provision of this Agreement shall be separately enforceable, and the invalidity of one provision shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. The failure of Educate78 to exercise any of its rights under this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such rights.
- k. This Agreement constitutes the only agreement, and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, both written and oral, among the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. All Exhibits hereto are a material part of this Agreement and are incorporated by reference. This Agreement, including any Exhibits hereto, may not be amended or modified, except in a writing signed by all parties to this Agreement.
