
















Lower school-wide **chronic absence** rate to below 16.3% by June 9, 2018
























### **Graduation Rate**

# Graduation Rate - Ethnicity & EL
























### **Whole School Grades Analysis**


# 2018-19 Big Rocks Overview

### What will we do better? (New Goals)

**English Learners:** 70% of students are reclassified by the end of 12th grade.

- 429 of our students are English Learners
- Of 318 students tested only 6 were able to pass the reclassification criteria (SRI & CELDT).
- 177 students have not made any growth for 2 years or more.

- What are your current literacy strategies?

    - Staff capacity and structures are being put in place for 9th grade literacy intervention
    - School-wide focus on literacy through PD and collaboration; non-English teachers investing in improving literacy outcomes for students

    - Literacy data is flat or worse than previous years, students are not growing by 2 grade levels or more per year












### Pathway Enrollment - Architecture Academy









### Pathway Demographics - Mandela (3 years)














## A-G Completion by Pathway - 12th










