1. Music Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

We have a wonderful music program which needs to be improved with better resources and supplies. Our current music program focuses on classical and traditional music. We would like to expand our offerings to add a cultural component focusing on various backgrounds, which more accurately represent our student body. For example, African Drumming, Latin and Mexican music. Students in grades 6-8 who participated in the California Healthy Kids Survey requested to be more connected to school. Only 60% reported being moderately connected to the school offerings.

\$7,965.00	maracas, etc.	Two sections of middle school will access the improved music program. Students will perform before semester award ceremonies, assemblies, and back to school night. Introducing new cultural components, Latino and African-American students will have an artistic outlet focused on their identities. Approximately 50 students can be introduced to the program 4 times a week.

2. Art Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

We do not have an Art Program but we do provide the opportunity to our students at an entry level. Students in grades 6-8 who participated in the California Healthy Kids Survey requested to be more connected to school. Only 60% reported being moderately connected to the school offerings. Although we are a STEM school, more conversations are being held to discuss a transition to STEAM. Many students desire art programs after school.

	camera, editing software, green screen,	As video feeds become more and more important, BayTech would like to begin a Video Club with approximately 10 students. These students will work on a number of projects including a BayTech welcome film, STEM EXPO recap, an educational YouTube Channel for BayTech, and assist in documenting the athletic programs for a year in review film to be displayed in June.

3. World Language Program

Programmatic Narrative Based on Rubric

BayTech plans to have a Spanish Culture Day event where the school can celebrate diversity and Spanish culture. This event will involve community, parents, students, and staff but focus on our Spanish students. A shift in demographics over the past five years has revealed a new majority, 65% of all students enrolled identify as Hispanic. Many of these students do not feel connected to the school due to a lack of cultural recognition. Student survey indicates that 72% of our middle school students speak (primarily) Spanish at home. These event would be a great way to build cultural awareness and school connectedness. Student discipline rates indicate nearly 70% of our middle school suspension demographics are Hispanic.

	vendors for dance, art, and food	Increase the awareness of the Hispanic Culture, improve cultural inclusion, build a positive school spirit, and celebrate the school's diversity. Approximately half of our middle school students identify as Hispanic. We will attempt to reduce discipline rates among our Hispanic students by offering more opportunities to appreciate, respect, and understand the Hispanic culture.

4. 5th to 6th Grade Enrollment Retention

Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis

Further human resources are needed in the office to help support the office manager so that data entry and data analysis is further supported and that enrollment retention is high. A bi-lingual secretary is preferred to communicate with our growing Hispanic population. Information will be more accurately presented to all students in middle school to help build a stronger school community and subsequently retain students. BayTech parents would like to see more culturally appropriate materials distributed to their children and themselves. Only 15% agreed that BayTech was doing a satisfactory job in this category. More club options have been requested and more translated information about school events would increase parent involvement and participation. Attendance among our Hispanic/Latino students would improve as student survey indicates that 72% of our middle school students speak (primarily) Spanish at home.

	Hiring a part-time bi-lingual (Spanish preferred) secretary to help support retention among 6 th grade.	Reduce truancy numbers by maintaining student attendance records and contacting parents of absentees. Contribute to the efficient operation of the school office. Students and parents will benefit from bilingual staff members during PT conferences, Back to School Night, and Orientations. Students will feel welcomed at school and more inclined to participate in the academic programs when they share similar traits with their faculty. Approximately 50-55 students of our Spanish-speaking middle school population would benefit by improved communications. Communicating the schools offerings at an
		early age will increase the percentage of students who continue at BayTech. In particular, students and families will be aware of the Seal of Bi-literacy award and set goals to earn the seal. Students will be aware of this opportunity to demonstrate proficiency in a language other than English. Parents will be aware of what our high school program offers; internships, service
		learning opportunities, use of technology, etc. BayTech's engaging students in robust learning experiences. These efforts were previously not communicated to all. Expectations are to retain 95 -100% of all

	middle school students with an addition secretary on staff.

5. Safe and Positive School Culture

Programmatic Narrative Based on Data Analysis

We are looking to expand our sports offerings to middle school students based on the student and parent requests. Students in grades 6-8 have expressed a strong desire to play basketball for an organized BayTech team. About 50% of parent responses indicate that BayTech provides quality sports, clubs or other activities to meet my child's needs. Currently, over 60% of the school's suspensions are between grades 6-8. Suspended middle school students would benefit greatly from athletic programs and once implemented suspensions rates can decrease.

\$20,000	Develop a middle school sports program for basketball and soccer – coaches, uniforms, facilities rental for practice and games	We would like to enter a middle school boys/girls basketball and soccer league and continue building self-esteem, leadership, and sportsmanship. Just like our high school students, all athletes will develop physical and mental discipline reflecting the core BayTech EAGLES values, with an emphasis on high academic standards and positive behavior. Therefore, improving our school culture. Student surveys indicate 50 - 60 students would benefit from the program. School values would be taught through athletics – to improve effective communication, academic achievement would rise, create goal-oriented students, and build social responsibility. This creative endeavor will help develop better attendance rates, improve test scores, and have a positive upswing in overall attitude toward school.
		BayTech will reduce office referrals by 50% and decrease suspension rates among middle school students by 50% offering a dedicated athletic program for students to participate in during last period. (3:36-4:20Pm) This has been identified as a problematic time for 7 th and 8 th grade

1. Mr. Hayri

- a) Welcomes everyone.
 - A staff member resigned, unfortunately. Back plans: Mr. Yusuf will teach 12th graders and Mr. Steve will teach the 10th and 11th graders. They have had one interview and he might come on board. Mr. Hayri mentions that we all go through things and don't always like our job, but just remember to empathize and think about our students first. Contact Mr. Wienclawski or Mr. Hayri to talk about any concerns/questions or if you need extra support. Mr. Hayri would like to fix any issues or concerns rather than just putting a band-aid on it. Ms. Powell thanks Mr. Hayri for being a great principal.

2. Mr. Wienclawski

- a) Mr. Wienclawski introduced the new update Measure G1. He reviewed the areas money will be allocated towards and asked for open comment from the staff.
 - Mr. Salinas mentioned the importance of finding a bi-lingual secretary to assist with translation and to improve communication with our students/parents.
