Growth Areas

Key areas of focus for ELLMA's work with DL:

Expand and enrich language opportunities in High School: we aspire for 80% of DL pathway graduates to have used language skills abroad, in an internship and/or dual enrollment.

Board adopted enrollment Policy to create linguistically and socio-economically diverse cohorts of students at DL schools to increase achievement and graduation for all.

Increase DL applicants from target communities (African-American, ELLs, low SES), using strategies such as coordinated outreach at Early Childhood Education centers.

Collaborate with Talent Division to recruit and retain high quality bilingual teachers

Investment in instructional materials that are aligned to needs of school program.

Adoption of curriculum and assessment based on evidence from pilot programs.
