- C. Tuberculosis Screening: CONTRACTOR is required to screen employees and agents who will be present at OUSD sites during the current school year. CONTRACTOR affirms that each person has current proof of negative TB testing on file and TB results are monitored. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.
- D. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this MOU and CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows: "CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the

course of providing services pursuant to the MOU, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. CONTRACTOR further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and CONTRACTOR has requested and reviews subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contact with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this MOU. In the event that OUSD, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this MOU, desires the removal of any CONTRACTOR related person, employee, representative or agent from any OUSD school; site; and/or property, CONTRACTOR shall immediately, upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire, cause the removal of such person or persons.

#### E. Insurance

Heart in Balance will provide two Marriage Family Therapist or Professional Clinical Counseling Trainees and two Registered Marriage Family Therapist or Registered Professional Clinical Counseling Interns who will provide direct services to students attending Peralta Elementary. Heart in Balance interns will provide (1) individual and group interventions and will be able to provide (2) school consultation services.

The goal of these services is to support students experiencing emotional, social, or behavioral challenges that are hindering their academic success. To meet this goal and support the Interns' integration into Peralta Elementary, Heart in Balance Trainees/Interns will:
