ADOPTING MEASURE N – COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS COMMISSION - EDUCATION IMPROVEMENT PLAN IMPLEMENTATION FINDINGS AND ASSESSMENTS TO DATE/GRANT AWARDS - 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR

WHEREAS, the Oakland Unified School District (“District”) Board of Education by Resolution Nos. 1415-0119 and 1415-0119A, has established, pursuant to the College and Career Readiness Act, the Measure N Commission, to oversee the Act including advising and reporting to the Board of Education and for (1) Planning, which includes (a) reviewing each high school's School Quality Review findings, Balanced Scorecard results, and education improvement plans, and (b) submitting school funding recommendations to the Board of Education for action; and (2) Oversight, which includes (a) oversight of proper allocation and use of all parcel tax monies, (b) reviewing annual independent audit reports, and (c) submitting recommendations to the Board of Education for any new or modified policies and administrative regulations to ensure the Oakland Unified School District's compliance with the requirements and intent of this Measure; and

WHEREAS, the Measure N – College and Career Readiness Oversight Commission, in its third year of operation, at its Regular Meeting on June 5, 2018, reviewed and affirmed its findings of named high schools implementation of Measure N to date and, consequently, determined and recommended Measure N Awards for the 2018-2019 School Year for each school named in attached Exhibit “A” as stated and hereby recommends approval of same by the Board of Education,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education hereby accepts and adopts the Measure N – College and Career Readiness - Oversight Commission Education Improvement Plan Implementation Findings and Assessments to Date and Grants Awards - 2018-2019 School Year to schools as delineated in attached Exhibit “A”; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby authorizes the Secretary to annotate the Legislative File of each school’s Application and Spending Plan, listed in Exhibit “A” (for purposes of full disclosure of the cumulative record of the transactions of the Measure N Commission and the Board, on each matter), as if each were an individually Board adopted legislative file; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby approves and appropriates from the Measure N Fund, as an Award, the stated cumulative 2018-2019 Funding for each named school in Exhibit “A”.

OVERVIEW & OBJECTIVE

Twenty six OUSD district schools and charter schools submitted their 2018-19 Measure N Education Improvement Plan (SPSA) that articulates the pathway development work done to date, the pathway development work planned for the upcoming academic year, and a clear Measure N budget.

The Measure N Commission held question and answer sessions for a total of 5 days during the months of April and May. During the question and answer sessions, Commissioners and Linked Learning High School Office staff asked clarifying and probing questions to further understand the thinking behind the Measure N Education Improvement Plans submitted.

Linked Learning High School Office staff have reviewed the 2018-19 Measure N Education Improvement Plans and applied a framework that looked at primarily 4 variables:

1. Implementing all phases of Linked Learning in the school
2. Quality of the Analysis and Plan
3. Alignment of Budget to the overall plan and outcomes
4. Information provided during questions and answer sessions

Seven schools who were determined as “Probationary” during the final recommendations of the 2016-17 academic year underwent an intensive probationary school process this academic year with the goal to support sites to develop their understanding of Linked Learning implementation by providing more feedback on their progress and building site capacity. The Measure N Commission approved 2018-19 funding recommendations for probationary schools on December 19, 2017. These schools will remain on probationary status during the 2018-19 academic year to continue the intensive supports as they transition into the implementation process.

Two schools who have been newly designated as “Probationary” will have increased level of supports, increased benchmarks aligned to Measure N, and include robust site visits, presentations to the Commission, and meetings with senior leadership during the 2018-18 school year to ensure compliance to the Measure.

Schools with corrective actions required to their Measure N budget were informed of the corrective actions required after initial recommendations were provided and worked with Linked Learning High School Office staff to review, revise, and resubmit to the Measure N Commission.

Schools who submitted revised Measure N budgets addressed feedback provided by both the Measure N Commission and staff. The schools who submitted revised Measure N budgets were reassessed to ensure compliance and final recommendations capture the revisions made by the school. For schools that indicate a recommendation “*with budget revision*”, an individual summary has been made available for that articulates the specific budget feedback provided to the school and how the feedback was addressed.
