Therefore, the CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all applicable Federal and California laws.
- 3. **Conflict of Interest**—CONTRACTOR shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. CONTRACTOR shall not hire any OUSD employee to perform the services in this MOU, and affirms that to the best of its knowledge no such conflict presently exists. CONTRACTOR agrees to alert OUSD in writing if and when a potential conflict arises.
- 4. Family Education Rights and Privacy Act—CONTRACTOR shall observe all District policies and regulations, and state and federal laws, including the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, related to the confidentiality of pupil and personnel records.
- C. **Tuberculosis Screening:** CONTRACTOR is required to screen employees and agents who will be present at OUSD sites during the current school year. CONTRACTOR affirms that each person has current proof of negative TB testing on file and TB results are monitored. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.
- D. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to CONTRACTOR's services under this Agreement and CONTRACTOR certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows: "CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the MOU, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1. CONTRACTOR further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and CONTRACTOR has requested and reviews. subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contact with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this MOU. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.

In the event that OUSD, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this MOU, desires the removal of any CONTRACTOR related person, employee, representative or agent from any OUSD school; site; and/or property, CONTRACTOR shall immediately, upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire, cause the removal of such person or persons.

E. Insurance

- 1. <u>General Liability: EITHER (a) CONTRACTOR maintains general liability</u> insurance that names OUSD as an additional insured, for operations, students, volunteers, and personnel at location where CONTRACTOR provides programs/services with at least \$1 Million in coverage, and furnish certificate of said insurance to OUSD OR (b) CONTRACTOR is not required to maintain general liability insurance under this agreement if the Risk Management Officer signs a waiver of insurance. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.
- <u>Workers' Compensation:</u> If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this MOU, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and federal laws, when applicable. The CONTRACTORS' Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.

- H. Register With/Update Community Partner Platform—Contractor shall register in OUSD's Community Partner Platform database and perform annual updates by August 31 of each year, to maintain full and complete up-to-date information.

SFJAZZ brings world-class jazz artists out of the concert hall and into the community, connecting youth and adults, students and professionals, and musicians and nonmusicians with a diverse array of interactive programs and events. From field trips to our unique SFJAZZ Center Auditorium, to hands on learning in their very own classrooms with jazz professionals, our School Programs give students access to jazz's rich and critical history. Our School Programs are provided free of charge to all Oakland public and charter middle schools.

SFJAZZ creates, presents, and develops audiences for the full spectrum of jazz, from the music's origins in the Caribbean Basin and the African American community to its diverse present-day expressions around the world, celebrating jazz as a constantly evolving tradition. SFJAZZ has transformed itself from a cultural nomad, presenting jazz in various venues around the San Francisco Bay Area, into an established advocate for the art form, and at 400 concerts per year, the largest nonprofit presenter of jazz in the United States. SFJAZZ Education programs serve more than 13,000 students each year, developing and nurturing intergenerational musicians and audiences within our diverse communities through rich and interactive programming in jazz appreciation, creation, and performance. The SFJAZZ Center serves as a convening place for an open, ever-changing and diverse community for the appreciation, education, and presentation of jazz in all its forms. SFJAZZ welcomes over 200,000 fans and students every year and has several award-winning resident jazz ensembles - the world-renowned SFJAZZ Collective and the SFJAZZ High School All-Stars.

In 2017 the SFJAZZ Education Department announced that it is expanding three inschool programs to reach every public middle school student in San Francisco and Oakland, including more than 23,000 public and charter middle school students in 70 schools, over the next three years. SFJAZZ has received a generous grant from the Stupski Foundation that will provide for this expansion and support bold new thinking in jazz education and teaching activities enabling the possible transformation of the lives of thousands of students, classrooms, teachers, and musicians.

For the current school year, the grant allows for the immediate expansion of SFJAZZ School Day Concerts, both at the SFJAZZ Center and at schools where students experience a live jazz concert, an increase in reach of the Jazz In The Middle program connecting jazz to humanities curriculum, and more music training through the Jazz In Session band support program for music teachers, band directors, and students.

Rebeca Mauleón, Director of Education, is an acclaimed pianist, composer, arranger, author, educator, and producer. Her composing credits include music for television, film, software, and symphony orchestra as well as artists such as Tito Puente, Carlos Santana, Joe Henderson, and others. Rebeca is a Grammy-nominated producer, a tenured professor



of music history, performance, and composition at City College of San Francisco and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and a contributing writer to *National Geographic* and *JazzTimes*.

Vanessa Varela, School Programs Manager, earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Art History and Studio Practice from San Francisco State University. She is currently a Human Rights Education graduate student at the University of San Francisco where she has also worked as an Academic Mentor with the School of Education's College Access Programs. She has worked with and continues to develop with Arts Integration Specialists at non-profits such as the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, where she contributes curriculum and facilitates educational programming, including research and development for general public outreach.
