Background	OACE receives ongoing funding through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title II to supplement state Adult Education funding. As a condition of funding, the CDE periodically reviews programs for compliance. To fulfill CDE and federal guidelines through the FPM Review process, OACE is requesting the Board to approve courses accepted by the CDE for 2017-18 and 2018-19.
Discussion	Approval by Board of Education of Adult and Career Education Course Offerings for the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 School Years for the Federal Program Monitoring (FPM) review process, as stated on the California Department of Education Adult Education 2018-19 Program Instrument, dated May, 2018, attached and incorporated herein by reference. According to the CDE's Adult Education 2018-19 Program Instrument, V. AE 07, 7.1, Evidence Requests, OACE must provide current and prior year courses approved by the local board. The courses approved by the CDE are the official course titles for OACE classes. The CDE allows for marketing titles of courses that fit under official titles to better promote classes in the community. OACE uses marketing titles such as "Family Literacy", "College and Career Readiness", and "GED Preparation" under these approved CDE course titles. All OACE courses meet optimum educational standards which contain goals and purposes, performance objectives or competencies, instructional strategies, units of study, with approximate hours allotted for each unit, evaluation procedures, and clear course completion requirements of established goals and objectives.

- 2.2 Funds made available for adult education and literacy activities shall supplement and not supplant other state or local public funds expended for adult education and literacy activities. (29 U.S.C. § 3331[a])
- 2.3 Except as specified in California *Education Code* (*EC*) § 52613, the governing board of a school district shall not impose a charge of any kind for a class in English and citizenship or a class in an elementary subject. A fee charge shall not be made for a class designated by the governing board as a class for which high school credit is granted when the class is taken by a person who does not hold a high school diploma. (*EC* § 52612[a])
- 2.4 The local financial management system must provide for the effective control and accountability for all funds, property, and other assets. Eligible provider must adequately safeguard all assets and assure that they are used solely for authorized purposes.
  (2 Code of Federal Regulations [2 CFR] § 200.302[b][4])
- 2.5 Any shared costs or matching funds and all contributions, including cash and third party in-kind contributions, are accepted when such contributions meet all of the following federal criteria, as part of the eligible provider's cost sharing or matching:

(a) Are verifiable from the non-federal entity's records;

(b) Are not included as contributions for any other federal award;

- (f) Are provided for in the approved budget when required by the federal awarding agency; and
- (g) Conform to other provisions of this part, as applicable. (2 CFR § 200.306[b])
- 2.6 Financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and all other records pertinent to a federal award must be retained for a period of three years from the date of submission of the final expenditure report. The only exceptions are the following:
  - (a) If any litigation, claim, or audit is started before the expiration of the three-year period, the records must be retained until all litigation, claims, or audit findings involving the records have been resolved and final action taken.
  - (b) When the non-federal entity is notified in writing by the federal awarding agency, cognizant agency for audit, oversight agency for audit, cognizant agency for indirect costs, or pass-through entity to extend the retention period.
  - (c) Records for real property and equipment acquired with federal funds must be retained for three years after final disposition.
  - (d) When records are transferred to or maintained by the federal awarding agency or pass-through entity, the three-year retention requirement is not applicable to the non- federal entity.
