






Gains & Opportunity for Growth

OUSD SRA 2017-2018 Attrition/Transition Data From Grade 5 (2016-2017) to Grade 6 (2017-2018)



The Grade 5 to 6 attrition rate Decreased by 2pp from the 2016-17 to the 2017-18 school am specialear. Santana Shann

- → 14% of students from districtrun elementary schools enrolled in private school, home schools, or outside of Oakland for grade 6
- 18% of students from districtrun elementary schools enrolled in Charters schools for grade 6











Regional Attrition/Transition Data



Northwest Oakland

- 56% transition to OUSD
- 27% transition to other schools (including private schools, other districts, homeschool, etc.)
- 17% transition to charters

North East Oakland - Grade 5

- 67% transition to OUSD
- 18% transition to charter schools
- 15% transition to other schools

West Oakland

- 65% Transition to OUSD
- 19% transition to charters
- 16% transition to other schools

Central Oakland

- 69% transition to OUSD
- 20% transition to charters
- 11% transition to other schools

East Oakland - Grade 5

- 76% transition to OUSD
- 18% transition to charters
- 8% transition to other schools



Overall Enrollment Data 2017-2018



- District-run school enrollment increased from 2016-17 by 232/+.06% students to 36,900*; comprising 69%/-1pp** of Oakland public school students.
- Charter school enrollment increased by 505/+3% to 15,977; comprising 31%/+1pp of Oakland public school students.

Overall Oakland public school enrollment increased from 2016-17 to 2017-18 by 674/+1.3%








Attrition/Transition Data African American Students








Attrition/Transition Data Asian Students
















Attrition/Transition Data Filipino Students
















Attrition/Transition Data Latino Students
















Attrition/Transition Data Multi Ethnicity Students












