WHEREAS, the BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN)'s services or program described in this MOU will be provided at no cost to OUSD (or students or parents unless otherwise agreed upon by both parties); and

BOTH PARTIES HEREBY enter into this MOU to enable BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) to provide said program(s) selected in Section II of the MOU.

(PLAN)'s services under this MOU there shall be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, physical disability, medical condition, marital status, sexual orientation, gender, age, or other legally protected class. Therefore, the BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) agrees to comply with all applicable Federal and California laws.
 - 3. Conflict of Interest—BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall abide by and be subject to all applicable OUSD policies, regulations, statutes or other laws regarding conflict of interest. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall not hire any OUSD employee to perform the services in this MOU, and affirms that to the best of its knowledge no such conflict presently exists. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) agrees to alert OUSD in writing if and when a potential conflict arises.
 - 4. Family Education Rights and Privacy Act—BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall observe all District policies and regulations, and state and federal laws, including the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, related to the confidentiality of pupil and personnel records. A separate Data Sharing Agreement is required if BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) seeks identifiable student information.
- C. Tuberculosis Screening: BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) is required to screen employees and agents who will be present at OUSD sites during the current school year. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) affirms that each person has current proof of negative TB testing on file and TB results are monitored. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.
- D. Fingerprinting of Employees and Agents. The fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 apply to BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN)'s services under this MOU. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) certifies its compliance with these provisions as follows:
 - CONTRACTOR certifies that CONTRACTOR has complied with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of Education Code section 45125.1 with respect to all CONTRACTOR's employees, subcontractors, agents, and subcontractors' employees or agents ("Employees") regardless of whether those Employees are paid or unpaid, concurrently employed by OUSD, or acting as independent contractors of CONTRACTOR, who may have contact with OUSD pupils in the course of providing services pursuant to the

MOU, and the California Department of Justice has determined that none of those Employees has been convicted of a felony, as that term is defined in Education Code section 45122.1.

CONTRACTOR further certifies that it has received and reviewed fingerprint results for each of its Employees and CONTRACTOR has requested and reviews subsequent arrest records for all Employees who may come into contact with OUSD pupils in providing services to the District under this MOU. [Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.]

In the event that OUSD, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this MOU, desires the removal of any BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) related person, employee, representative or agent from any OUSD school; site; and/or property, BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall immediately, upon receiving notice from OUSD of such desire, cause the removal of such person or persons.

E. Insurance

- 1. General Liability: (a) BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) maintains general liability insurance that names OUSD as an additional insured, for operations, students, volunteers, and personnel at location where BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) provides programs/services with at least \$1 Million in coverage, and furnish certificate of said insurance to OUSD. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.
- 2. Workers' Compensation: If CONTRACTOR employs any person to perform work in connection with this MOU, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at all times during the performance of such work, Workers' Compensation Insurance in conformance with the laws of the State of California and federal laws, when applicable. The CONTRACTORS' Employers' Liability Insurance shall not be less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident or disease. Please see Section IV for the relevant documentation that is required.

(PLAN)'S services are aligned with the School(s) and OUSD's mission and objectives and are adequately meeting student's needs. At the request of School(s) or OUSD staff, BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall provide reasonable data and information to students participating in the BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN)'s program.
- G. Confidentiality—BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall maintain strict confidentiality of all information about individual students received under this MOU and will not disseminate such information without the express written consent of OUSD. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) will comply with FERPA, and will be allowed to use the data received to solicit funding to continue to expand its services/program, so long as there is no information from which the identity of any student in the BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN)'s program as a participant could be made.

H. Register With/Update Provider Database—In order to maintain accurate up-to-date information on the services provided, Bay Area Parent Leadership Action Network. (PLAN) shall register in OUSD's provider database, update schools of operation prior to commencing services during subsequent school years, and update during the current school year when Bay Area Parent Leadership Action Network. (PLAN)'s schools of operation change.

IV. Required Documents

BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) CANNOT commence the services agreed to in this MOU until it has submitted the following documents:

IX. Jurisdiction

This MOU shall be performed in Oakland, California and is governed by the laws of the State of California. The Alameda County Superior Court or the United States District Court for the Northern District of California shall have jurisdiction over any civil action arising out of or relating to this MOU.

X. Notices

Any notice provided for in this MOU shall be in writing and effective upon receipt at the address set forth below in this section, delivered by any of the following means: personal delivery; certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested; or electronic mail. Either party may change the addresses below by giving notice of such change pursuant to this section.

XII. Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion

(PLAN) certifies to the best of his/her/its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency according to Federal Acquisition Regulation Subpart 9.4, and by signing this contract, certifies that this vendor does not appear on the Excluded Parties List (https://www.sam.gov/).

XIII. Integration and Modification

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This MOU may be amended or modified only in writing, signed by both Parties.

XIV. Assignment

The rights and obligations of the each Party under this MOU shall not be assigned without the express prior written consent of the other Party.

XV. Waiver

No delay or omission by either Party in exercising any right under this MOU shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right provided for in this MOU.

XVI. No Rights in Third Parties

This MOU does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.

XVII. Counterparts

This MOU and all amendments and modifications to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.

XVIII. Intellectual Property

During the term of this MOU, any works created by or inventions of Bay Area Parent Leadership Action Network. (PLAN), his agents or employees, within the scope of the work contracted herein shall belong to the District together with all associated

copy rights and patents. Bay Area Parent Leadership Action Network. (PLAN) shall not publish any aspect of the work performed hereunder without prior written consent of the District.

XIX. Relationship of Parties

This is not an employment contract. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN), in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of OUSD, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of OUSD and/or to which OUSD's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation.

BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) shall assume full responsibility for payment of all Federal, State, and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN)'s employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, BAY AREA PARENT LEADERSHIP ACTION NETWORK. (PLAN) is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, OUSD being interested only in the results obtained.

XX. Signature Authority

Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been given the proper authority and empowered to enter into this Agreement.

XXI. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits

Founded in 2004, Bay Area Parent Leadership Action Network (PLAN) works to empower parents to be leaders in their children's education, so that all children get an excellent education.

We believe all parents want their children to succeed in school. But many lack the skills, knowledge, and confidence to successfully navigate the school system on their children's behalf.

PLAN engages and empowers parents through <u>training</u>, <u>organizing</u>, and <u>campaigns</u>. Our trainings give parents the tools they need to be active in their child's learning. Our organizing connects families who are transforming schools. Our parent-led campaigns, such as Oakland LEAD, equip parents to serve as leaders in challenging and changing systems that aren't working for our kids.

We actively work with parents to create unity across language and culture, strengthening their efforts to hold all stakeholders accountable for providing a quality education to every student and for respecting and valuing every child and family.

From the beginning, PLAN's has chosen to work with parents of color at "low performing" schools, to have the greatest impact on increasing the number of students graduating from high school college and career ready. Since 2013, our programs have served 2,000 parents: 42% of them Latino, 30% Black, 6% Filipino, 5% Chinese, 5% Vietnamese, 5% Arabic, 1% each Laotian, Samoan, Tongan, American Indian, African, and 2% other.

Our PLAN to LEAD and Parents Ready for School programs developed parent and staff leaders, who conducted school-readiness training for parents in their community, with funding from Zellerbach Foundation and First 5 Alameda County. Graduates from PLAN to LEAD are employed with school districts as Parent Liaisons, Outreach Specialists, Department Chairs, and in other leadership roles. Our graduates advanced the transformation of at least 25% of East Oakland schools in OUSD between 2010-2014.

In 2012, parent leaders co-developed PLAN's Parent Organizing Fellowship Program, in which graduates of PLAN programs interned with our Lead Organizer to deepen their advocacy and organizing skills, with the support of The California Endowment.

In 2013, with funding from Kellogg Foundation, we launched Leaders for Engaged and Active Parents (LEAP), which has provided principals and staff in East Oakland school ongoing coaching and support to work with families as partners; and provided leadership development training to parents, for specific campaigns related to family engagement.

PLAN has had longstanding partnerships with the Oakland, Berkeley, and San Francisco school districts, among others. We were a core partner in the development of the OUSD Family, School and Partnership Office and have been on the OUSD Family Engagement Advisory Committee since its inception.

Since 2007, City of Oakland Head Start has been a partner with PLAN in our Parents Ready for School Program and PLAN to LEAD training. To date we have trained 140+ parents and 60% of Head Start Family Advocates. For the last 2 years, we have worked with Head Start to integrate our Parents Ready for School curriculum into its overall strategy. We collaborate with other organizations that work with families in early childhood settings, including Lotus Bloom, Tandem, First 5 Alameda County, and Bay Area Discovery Museum.

We work in partnership with many East Oakland agencies to ensure families are accessing services that will help their children be school ready.

PLAN's six-member Board oversees our operations and finances. All Board members receive ongoing training to ensure they are skilled in their fiduciary responsibilities. Our Financial and Admin. Team includes our Executive Director, Program Director, Communications & Development Lead, Administrative Lead and a contract Accountant.

Our Program staff reports to the Program Director and includes the Campaign Lead, the Organizing Lead and an Early Success Organizer. Additionally, the Family School Partnership Lead coordinates the Leaders for Engaged and Active Parents Program (LEAP) and guides and supports the work of a Parent Trainer and Parent Organizer

PLAN has successfully managed many restricted foundation grants as well as four consecutive competitively awarded from First 5 Alameda.
