Pathway Vision	What is the instructional vision and desired experience for students that will drive the pathway? Our vision is that every student leaves GSP with the skills, habits, and mindset necessary to be successful in college and career. We want to focus on the skills and knowledge common to entrepreneurs because of their broad application. As stated in the CTE standards, "Entrepreneurial thinking may be applied to all industry sectors." We have identified 8 entrepreneurial skills that we want all students to leave GSP with: Communication, Collaboration, Problem Solving, Self-Management, Grit, Innovation, Vision, and Competitiveness. The vision is that these skills show up in all academic classes so that students see these skills as integrated, even if some elements are still content-specific. We want our students to understand how cultural/ethnic/generational differences affect interpersonal interactions/communications (C5.1) so that they are prepared to leverage their assets in skills in college and career. Our scholars will recognize failure as an opportunity to learn. They will leave GSP ready, willing, and able to apply an entrepreneurial mind and skillset to face the challenges ahead.

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
