#### **Budget Review, discussion and approval**

The District has opened access to the budget for Principals. For Montera the following data points are to be noted:

- The District is projecting a decrease in enrollment of 70 students to a total of 677. However, the 2018-19 projections were at 727, we are now at 731 (received 10 news students at the beginning of the year) with potentially more 6th and 8th graders to come.
  - o 6th grade 192; 7th grade 195; 8th grade 242= Subtotal 629
  - SDC students at all grades 48= Grand total of 677
- The district pays for the minimum numbers of teachers to cover the anticipated 677 students resulting in ~24FTE (23.59). The school operates with 36 teachers, the remainder salaries are covered by combinations of grants, ballot measures and other means of money allocations by the Principal.
- Z score for Montera is 1 (lowest) this is a scoring mechanism allocated by the district for additional moneys based on the geographical location of the school, not per the student.
- Concentration funds are state funds allocated per the LCFF to high needs schools with over 50% high needs student population. Montera is at ~40%.
- Part of the <u>Unrestricted Discretionary</u> funds will be allocated up to the 35% allowed - to fund personnel - the librarian.
- Supplemental funds will be allocated to fund several teachers.
- <u>Measure G funds</u> will be allocated to fund the remainder of the Librarian's nd IB support salaries
- <u>Measure G1 funds</u> will be allocated to cover the salaries of 1 Music teacher and 1 Art Teacher and supplies for art and music.

- After School program funds we do not receive any at this time, but the staff is looking and a variety of option that would reduce the costs once again and make the after school program more accessible for families.
- <u>Title 1 funds</u> allocated to the Restorative Justice Program and the Manhood development program in form of salaries.
- <u>Title 4 funds</u> not available

**Motion by Vince Stewart** to adopt allocation of Title 1 Funds as proposed by Principal Avent **Seconded**: Dr. Gilyard-Shyne; **Motion Carried**: Unanimous

#### Discussion:

As Mr. Avent begins his work on the budget he shared with us some of his priorities that will guide his decisions and proposals to the SSC, and they are:

- Retain Ms Roger (librarian) full time. Presently this is achieved via Measure G moneys, and keep all our teachers here.
  - o goal achieved through a variety of funding allocations.
- Measure G1 is anticipated with approximately \$180K to be allocated to cover the additional 1 art and music teachers required by the IB program.
   Additionally, the remaining funds will be used for supplies in both Art and Music and Woodshop.
  - o goal achieved
- ASES moneys at the state and county levels are anticipated. Mr Avent to look
  into this with potential use to reinstate the lower cost, more widely accessible
  after school program as we had in previous years.
  - o ACTION: To be researched by Mr. Avent.
- Establish a redirection room with the right person (salary), with solid implicit bias training and capable of addressing redirection within the RJ and curriculum lenses.
  - o ACTION: Research in progress by Mr. Avent.
- SalesForce funds not received at this time. allocations to be at the discretion of the Principal.

Jo Lee went to the SSC forum provided by the district and found it very informative and would like to participate in these opportunity along with other members of the SSC.

Thanks to G1 funding Montera has added 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade Choir, 2 semesters of 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Music Exploratory, 2 semesters of 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Choir and 2 semesters of 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Music Exploratory, intermediate and beginning band. We had 397 students take a music class during the 118-19 school year. That's 55% of the school population 5% short of our goal.
