3. Upcoming Assessment Schedule

 - i. Jen Joyce, ITL, shared the upcoming schedule for the Math and Informational Reading IAB schedule. We will be on a special block schedule for three days (February 19, 20 and 21).
 Scholars will be pulled into the library by grade, alphabetically and will take 2 Math IABs and 1 Informational Reading IAB.
 - ii. The schedule is as follows

4. Measure G1

- a. 2018/2019 Self Assessment
 - i. Principal Taylor shared information regarding possible Measure G1 funding for next school year. She shared the current year's funding (2018-19) that was approved and asked the ILT to assist in preparing for submission of the application for the 2019-2020 school year. She then shared the proposed funding allocations for the upcoming school year with the ILT. They agreed with the FTE of the Drama Teacher and Choir/Dance Teacher being increased to 1.0 to align with the school's vision of becoming an Arts Focused School and allowing for more scholars to have access to those electives by offering more sections. The ILT also agreed with the implementation of Mindfulness Practices to assist in decreasing the number of discipline incidents on campus through partnering with the Niroga Institute for next school year.
 - ii. Principal Taylor asked that the group assist in the self-assessment portion of the application. The group assessed the current status of the Arts and Music Programs through the use of the rubric that was provided with the application. They were able to come to consensus on all areas being assessed and therefore completed that portion of the application.

i. Principal Taylor reviewed the entire application with the team (with the addition now of the self-assessment portion) and began drafting out the narrative portion as well. All members

agreed that the application should move forward with the approved self-assessment and any minor revisions she (Principal Taylor) would make to the narrative section of the application.

Our Drama Teacher is in place and is averaging 20 scholars per section (for a total of approximately 100 scholars) participating in Drama this school year. A success of the Drama Program was our Winter FAN (Fine Arts Night) where drama scholars performed original skits written and directed by their peers. The topics chosen were those that are relevant to the experience of young people today (bullying, trying to fit in with peers and there was even a fairytale with a teenage spin to it).

Some of the challenges that we have encountered is not enough sections of Drama to support the Schoolwide Master Schedule. Since the Drama teacher is only 0.8 FTE the times in the day in which Drama can be offered has been challenging to ensure maximum access to all scholars throughout the school day.
