She maintains an organized, sanitary cafeteria and contributes so much more to the school community. Parents are regularly returning to the school to give Ms. Cox updates on their children. Known as a master at her job, she has assisted in the training of new employees without hesitation, and, as a result of her influence and thoroughness, all have grown and exceeded their positions, becoming excellent employees for the District, and

WHEREAS, Dana Wood, Custodian at Bridges Academy, is commended and recognized because, beyond an affinity for keeping the entire school squeaky clean, he is a bright presence in the school community, greeting every single student one-by-one and very endearingly, making each feel welcomed and special.
