There is no formal system to recognize or celebrate students' home language(s) except for than our bilingual and multilingual celebrations. Students do not have the opportunity to use the target language in a real-world setting. There are limited attempts to foster global awareness in students.

\$34,010.54	0.4 Spanish Teacher including benefits, prep time, and 2 45 minute sessions with each of our 6 classes (2 - 6th, 2 - 7th, 2 - 8th) per week.	100% of middle school scholars would recieve year 1 Spanish and have the ability to practice the language in a real world setting. Additionally, the Spanish teacher would support to identify and starting a student program towards the Seal of Biliteracy/ Biliteracy pathway awards, and set goals to earn the seal.


