

## **Next Steps: Facilities**

#### Partnering to Upgrade the Castlemont Campus

#### Use Prop 51 to

- Return Building 100 to Castlemont for continued Castlemont growth
- Create a separate space for LPS to eliminate shared classrooms on traditional Castlemont campus. Cap LPS enrollment.
- Build an Early College Center housing college classes for Castlemont & LPS students

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# Leverage Prop 51 to Anchor Community

#### **Castlemont facilities upgrades in place or underway**

- \$400,000 LPS investment in Building 100 already completed
- Joint Early College Center through Prop 51
- Seeking additional funding for Castlemont upgrades underway

#### Leveraging partnerships to meet program needs

- Ongoing LPS support of Castlemont athletics and garden
- Castlemont SF Foundation grant of \$200,000/yr for 3 years
- Loyola Marymount University SpEd Residency Program including Castlemont and LPS
- Oakland funders interest in supporting campus and program visioning, staff collaboration and projects
