Oakland Unified School District has been diligently dedicating District funds to address student and staff safety, however the reality is that budgetary restrictions prevent the purchase of technology and equipment that is desperately needed. Enrollment has dropped as Charter Schools continue to pull students away, resulting in decreasing budgets. A teacher strike has just completed, and Oakland Unified School District is in the process of determining how to meet union demands. Staffing cuts took place, and budget estimates are still showing shortfalls. Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) serves nearly 50,000 students across 126 schools in Oakland, CA. The OUSD Office of Emergency Services works collaboratively with students, faculty, staff, surrounding community and local, state and federal agencies to ensure all members of the OUSD community are prepared to respond as a community, quickly and effectively to any potentially hazardous or dangerous situation. In the most recent district-wide assessment of building-level school safety threats, risks and vulnerabilities, OSPD identified 29 schools (serving 11,705 students) with high rates of on-campus crime. In direct alignment to the risks identified and prioritized through the ongoing Site Safety Assessment process, OUSD is requesting funding to support evidence-based school safety interventions allowable through the SVPP grant. Activities will include: (1) Funding will support training for 57 School Security Officers and 10 OSPD Law Enforcement Officials. (2) Funding will equip 15 school sites with additional entry buzzers and metal detector wands at 10 school sites. (3) Funding will support the acquisition of 16 laptop computers, enabling School Security Officers and OSPD Law Enforcement to create incident reports efficiently, access trainings, and deliver trainings. (4) Funding will support the acquisition of Crisis Go, which is a safety platform/mobile app. OUSD will implement the Safe2SpeakUp App at Oakland Technical High School, since the school has 2 campuses that are approximately .5 miles apart, thus a 12-minute walk, this APP will allow School Administrators, as well as OSPD, to communicate with students during transition periods as well as allow students to "check in" with the School Administration. (5) Funding will support acquisition and distribution of evacuation maps and safety maps at all of the targeted high-risk schools. (6) Finally, funding will support acquisition of a visitor management/check-in system at the targeted high-risk schools
