BACKGROUND

According to Title 5 Sections 80021-80021.1, the Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) was created in response to the phasing out of emergency permits and became effective on July 1, 2005. It allows an employing agency to hire an individual who has not yet met the subject matter competence requirement needed to enter an internship program. Prior to requesting a PIP, the employing agency must verify that a diligent search has been made, and a fully credentialed teacher cannot be found.

The PIP is only available at the request of an employing agency. Individuals may not apply directly to the Commission for this document. Holders of the PIP are restricted to service with the employing agency requesting the permit. An employing agency is defined as a California public school district, county office of education, non-public school, charter school, or statewide agency.

The PIP is available in the areas of Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialist. Individuals who were issued four or fewer emergency permits may be issued one PIP as long as the employer requirements have been met. Individuals who were issued five emergency permits do not qualify for the PIP.

DISCUSSION

The Board of Education, exercising the power of the Governing Board, may approve an application seeking a Provisional Internship Permit from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, as may be necessary for certain certificated employees of the District so they may work in the District for the 2019-2020 school year, as follows:

The current request for the 2019-2020 school year, a Provisional Internship Permit is being sought for the following employees:

- 1. Ariel Brooks graduated from California State University, East Bay with a Bachelor's in Human Development: Early Childhood Development Option. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET Exams and the requirements for a University Intern Education Specialist: Mod/Sev teaching credential.
- 2. Gabriel Kindred graduated from CSU, EAST BAY with a Bachelor's in Business Administration. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Specialist Ed. Mild/Mod teaching credential.
- 3. Andrew Gallo graduated from California State University, Stanislaus with a Bachelor of Art's in Kinsesloglogy. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Single Subject teaching credential.
- 4. Tamila Jackson gradated from UC, Davis with a Bachelor of Science in Human Development. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Multiple Subject teaching credential.
- 5. Stephanie Clark graduated from UC Berkeley with Bachelor of Arts in Spanish. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Multiple Subject teaching credential.
- 6. Jeffrey Worall graduated from Western State Colorado University with Bachelor of Arts in Music. The Provisional Internship Permit will allow candidate time to complete the CSET exams and the requirements for a University Internship Single Subject teaching credential.
