

What is Work-Based Learning?

- A core component of the Linked Learning Approach
- An instructional strategy essential in preparing students for success in post-secondary education and careers
- Expose students to future career options
- Develop and apply a set of student learning outcomes

Work-Based Learning Experiences...

- involve interactions with industry or community professionals that are linked to school-based instruction;
- are intentionally designed to help students extend and deepen classroom work and focus on learning outcomes

The term "work-based" does not mean the experience must occur at a workplace or during the standard "work day"









Work-Based Learning Continuum:

The Student Journey

Students learn about careers in a pre-pathway or CTE class, practice career readiness through 21st century skills integration in classrooms, and learn from and with industry and community partners about core and career concepts.

Students visit job sites to better understand various careers and to learn how to interact with new professionals, learn job application skills and learn from and with industry and community partners about core and career concepts.

Students practice and apply job application skills, including mock interviews and resume writing, engage in project-based learning with industry and community partners, and participate in an extended internship.

Students demonstrate mastery of technical learning with industry and community feedback, prepare to onboard to an apprenticeship, intern in a clinical setting, or gain direct work experience while supported in a Work Experience Education Program.










OUSD Pathway Enrollment






Swinerton/OUSD/Fremont Partnership























Swinerton: We build structures but more importantly we change lives.

Awareness/Exploration: Skilled Trades Career Fairs.

Exploration/Preparation: Working with Fremont to redesign and repurpose the school deck.

Preparation/Training: Worked with the Fremont students and staff to build the structure. Provided funding for materials.

Career: In June 2019, they hired Eduardo Guzman. He is working on a Swinerton Project on Stanford Campus
