Information Needed How will this grant contribute to sustained student achievement or academic standards?	TUPE Health Disparities program is a youth empowerment program that will engage youth at high risk for tobacco-related health disparities in comprehensive tobacco prevention, education, and intervention. Youth Peer Educators training youth is our model. Gold standard is that every student is involved in a community building project that serves their school's peers. Our target priority populations for this grant are students in non-traditional schools, LGBTQ+ youth, and students who have recently immigrated, across 11 target schools identified by relevant CHKS data. The project curricula will afford partnership with content related instruction that empowers program participants with opportunities to conduct prevention efforts in classrooms, with staff, and to parents, develop social media, advocate policy changes to lawmakers, and promote a tobacco and drug free lifestyle in their communities. TUPE Intervention Coaches will be trained to operate the program in collaboration with teachers. Program participants will be taught that they have personal significance and worth. Activities and projects will reflect their unique talent and passion sets. Students will train their peers in the same techniques and thus retain the info while utilizing adult learning skills. School culture will be improved by strengthening personal relationship skills like, assertiveness, cultural competency, and leadership. Individual achievement will be enhanced by learning pro and con analysis, problem solving, goal setting, and group projects with the aim being to increase students' readiness for college and career. Attendance, GPA, and graduation rate will benefit when students are fully engaged in meaningful work that is relevant to them and
	showcases their potential all the while presenting them in a positive light with their peers.

How will this grant be evaluated for impact upon student achievement? (Customized data design and technical support are provided at 1% of the grant award or at a negotiated fee for a community-based fiscal agent who is not including OUSD's indirect rate of 3.25% in the budget. The 1% or negotiated data fee will be charged according to an Agreement for Grant Administration Related Services payment schedule. This fee should be included in the grant's budget for evaluation.)	For process measures, the TUPE Program Manager will review data regularly to ensure that processes are operating as envisioned and scheduled. Additionally, annually, the external evaluator will review input from school leaders from the 11 partner schools and develop recommendations for the following year if merited. For presentation and parent impact tools, the external evaluator will compile and review data in December and May. Both reviews will assess progress toward objectives and look for any differential impacts along gender and race/ethnicity. To assess the impact of intervention supports, at the end of the year the external evaluator will download all participant responses and gauge progress toward objectives (cessation efforts, reductions, and resiliency factors), as well as differential impacts along gender and race/ethnicity. CHKS and Peer Educator impact data will be analyzed alongside these measures to assess if objectives were met to reduce disparity and create empowering experiences for youth. Annually, findings from each of the data sources will be compiled into an evaluation report which, depending on our findings, may include recommendations for improvement. The Behavioral Health Dept. will reflect upon findings and move forward with recommendations as appropriate.
