VII. Measure G1 Carryover

Maya Taylor: Advised last Thursday at the Principal's Meeting that we have a Measure G1 carryover of \$6,893.00 and we need to engage our communities in how these monies should be spent.

Measure G1 is to provide access to courses in Arts & World Languages as well as create a more positive and safe learning environment and to retain more students transitioning to middle from elementary school. We have received these funds for the last 3 years and have used it to fund:

 Drama Teacher; Dance/Choir Teacher; Music Instruments & Supplies in the Arts (dance barres, classroom supplies for drama, art and music classes)

We need to engage all Westlake communities and I am bringing this to the SSC. Any ideas/suggestions on how we should spend the money?

Hakeem Bey: Use all funds so there is no more carryover. Our kids need more resources so we should use as much as possible. For retaining kids, more classroom support/ more exposure to life/ more help for the after school program.

Maya Taylor: Exposure to what specifically?

Hakeem Bey: Tech courses, gardening, cooking – anything that can enrich their lives and experiences and they can take a skill or knowledge away.

Morgan Cohen: Money can be spent any way that we wish?

Maya Taylor: Yes, as long as it in within the three parameters-providing access to courses in Arts & World Languages, creating a positive and safe learning environment and retaining rising 5^{th} graders in OUSD.

Hakeem Bey: If there is something is working, we should fund more of that. Ruqayyah Abdul-Rahim: What current things are in place for 5th to 6th grade retention?

Maya Taylor: Summer Program – AlM High; purchased supplies and Westlake swag (hoodie/lanyard) for incoming 6th graders

Ebado Ismail: Music instruments

Ideal Franklin: OAL has told athletic directors only one coach will be paid for sports.

Morgan Cohen: Uniforms for sports teams, equipment, coaches for sports to be paid as well as taking our athletes to play outside of OUSD and exposing them to other environments.

Thuy Minh Nguyen: Transportation for College for All Field Trips for our 8th grade class.

Hakeem Bey: Would be ideal to find out exactly what the students want.

Zuri Cheffon: In drama class, kids want to go boating.

Apryl Haynes: Agree with Zuri, should ask scholars, specifically in 108 SOAR Center to find out what they need in class/school (art on walls, math on walls, something to trigger them to stay in class.

Ruqayyah Abdul-Rahim: As far as engaging 6th graders, some type of event where 6th graders talk to current 8th graders to ask or answer questions.

Morgan Cohen: Agree; would be go to show incoming scholars what is expected of them at Westlake.

Ideal Franklin: Maybe paying additional speaker guests for the upcoming empowerment assemblies.

Ruqayyah Abdul-Rahim: It is difficult to find people to come without a paying them for their time.

Hakeem Bey: Maybe a guided survey for kids so we aren't overwhelmed with ideas.

Ideal Franklin: Trophies for sports teams.

Morgan Cohen: Money for an athlete's banquet

Maya Taylor: Next week, I will host a session at lunch with scholars to see what

they believe the money should be spent on and will speak with network

superintendent and present all ideas from communities to him.

VIII. Public Input

April Haynes: Would like to discuss SOAR Center, instead of scholars just sitting there, they should really reflect on (i.e.i write an essay). Dr. Joy has a mindfulness card game that relaxes the body, mind spirit and is fun and engaging. Do not understand why the same scholars are in the SOAR Center every day. Speaking out as we are missing something and need to trigger these scholars educationally because the time they are spending in there is not productive at all. Maya Taylor: We hear your concerns and 2 weeks ago, we changed the structure in the SOAR Center. Now, all scholars are required to fill out reflections, parents are notified when a scholar is in the SOAR center, it is no longer a place to just sitteachers are loading assignments onto Google classroom, Khan Academy is accessible for skill building and again, all scholars are required to answer questions in reflection. The SOAR center is now hosted by Mr. Omolade on Mondays, Mr. Ige on Tuesdays and Thursdays and myself or Mr. Thompson on Wednesday and Fridays. Teachers are coming by on the prep period to offer academic support. We find that a lot of scholars who are frequenting the SOAR Center are experiencing trauma at home. Different approaches are being tried. This is the first year that we have continuity in staffing in the Case Manager position, this staff member deals with the most difficult scholars every day. We have also connected COST processes and these scholars are flooded with resources; some scholars we see daily in the SOAR Center as 6th graders and by

the time they are in 8th grade, do not come to the SOAR Center at all. Westlake serves every scholar on the spectrum from 4.0 scholars to scholars in the SDC ICE class. We recognize that the same program does not work every time, it is great to have parents come in as thought partners and collaborators. In another week or so, you will continue to see changes in the SOAR Center. Administrators are blocking off days, it is a different thing for scholars when they have to face the principal.

Apryl Haynes: As Parents of Westlake, here for staff and parents. Would love to teach children and interact. How can I bring my skills (conflict resolutions or a space for a child to be themselves (i.e. loud or quiet)).

Maya Taylor: Create a proposal, bring it the administration and if you plan on being here more than 2-3 times, you must volunteer through the District Office and any scholars you work with would need to have a signed permission slip from their parents.


