CTE & Rigorous Academics Integration

- Intro Pathway course and full 10th-12th Pathway sequence: 10th Biology and Public Health, Intermediate Public and Community Health, Medical Terminology (dual enrollment), Senior Seminar: Public and Community Health
- Pathway integration in core academic classes, including: US History and Public Health, Anatomy, Health and Wellness, Medical Chemistry and Public Health
- Cross disciplinary/grade level integrated projects focused on Public and Community Health (9-12)
- Integration of CTE standards into all Math & Science classes (expanding to other disciplines)
- Completion of Graduate Profile that includes critical aspects related to Public and Community Health
- Freshman Seminar: College and Career Success









Program of Study

- 9th College and Career Seminar: Success 101 developed to introduce students to pathway and begin the focus on college and career success. (includes 10 year plan, college and career awareness and exploration. Integration of Medical Math (formerly Numeracy), and Health and Wellness
- 10th 12th GFSF curriculum integrated into advisory
- 10th Biology and Community Health PLUS core academic courses
- 11th Intermediate Public & Community Health/Medical terminology; Medical Chemistry and Public Health PLUS core academic courses, including U.S. History and Public Health
- 12th Senior Seminar Capstone/Advanced Public and Community Health - (includes Senior internship) PLUS core academic courses, including Anatomy









What are some examples of the implementation of your plan?

- Intentionality around the design team representation of each of the linked learning pillars
- Advisory Board including more Public Health Industry professionals
- Addition of WBL liaison to support Seminar:
 Public and Community Health internships and piloting of summer internships
- Black Student Union (BSU)
- Working with special education department to identify students with 504 and IEPs to support differentiated learning and individualized student support
