The following grant conditions apply:

- 1. The grant award will be processed upon receipt of the signed Grant Award Notification (AO-400). This AO-400 must be signed by the superintendent or an authorized official and returned within 10 working days.
- 2. All approved program funds must be expended within the dates designated and for the maximum amount indicated on the AO-400. Encumbrances may be made at any time after the beginning date of the grant stated on the AO-400. No extensions of this grant will be allowed.
- 3. The grantee is required to only use these funds to support attendance at the California Partnership Academies Conference, professional development activities, and/or information technology related items and equipment for the operation and maintenance of the California Partnership Academies (CPA) at the high school noted in the AO-400 in accordance with the provisions of California Education Code (EC) sections 54690 through 54699. These funds may not supplant current fixed costs. Expenditures shall comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state, and local rules, regulations, and policies relating to the administration and accounting for public school funds, including but not limited to the EC. These funds are instructional in nature. These funds may not be used for out-of-state travel expenses.
- 4. The grantee must limit administrative indirect costs to the rate approved by the California Department of Education (CDE) for the applicable fiscal year in which the funds are spent.
- 5. Upon receipt of the required certifications, scheduled payments of grant funds will be as follows:
 - The first 90 percent of the funds will be released upon completion and return of the AO-400. Please allow approximately four weeks for processing.
 - The final payment will be processed after receipt of the End-of-Project (EOP) Expenditure
 Report. The EOP Expenditure Report is due after all funds have been expended but no later
 than 30 days after the end of the grant period. The EOP Expenditure Report should include
 a narrative of expenditures. Failure to submit a final EOP Expenditure Report with a detailed
 narrative within 45 days from the end of the grant period will result in a billing from the CDE
 for the entire amount of any grant funds paid and possible reduction of any subsequent
 years' grants.
- 6. At least three key staff members from each CPA are required to attend the CPA Conference to be held February 27–29, 2020, at the Long Beach Convention Center. These funds can be used for that purpose.
- 7. If the grantee terminates its participation in the program, the grantee shall submit a final expenditure report within 30 days and return the unexpended funds upon receipt of a billing from the CDE. Supplies and equipment purchased with these funds will be redirected to other CPA sites.
