BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

As you may know, the California School Boards Association (CSBA) is a collaborative group of virtually all of the state's more than 1,000 school district and county offices of education, which advocates for and promotes the interest of K-12 children through a variety of organized means.

The Association's governance structure, in part, provides for a Delegate Assembly, elected, in part, by member school boards divided into Subregions. The Oakland Board is a member of the Association and is geographically located in Subregion 7-B (Alameda County).

Presently there are three delegates to be elected to the Delegate Assembly from Subregion 7-B of the Association for a two-year term commencing April 1, 2020. The Assembly will meet at least twice a year to conduct business and may also meet with other Delegates and Director of the Region and otherwise act in the interests of the Association.

Three school board member candidates within CSBA Subregion 7-B have qualified to seek the office. Upon conferring with our other Board Assembly delegate, Gary Yee, we recommend that the Board support the following three candidates: James Aguilar, San Leandro Unified School District; Mialisa Bonta, Alameda Unified School District; and Anne White, Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District.

CSBA can follow the Colorado SBA by authoring a resolution, and increase advocacy efforts in this realm and set out frameworks for environmental policy in education imagine increased green literacy, zero waste initiatives and bus emission mitigation. We can do it all, together.
