Work Permits

The Governing Board recognizes that part-time jobs can give students needed supplementary income, valuable work experience, and enhanced self-esteem. However, the Board also believes that outside employment should not interfere with students' educational progress nor impair their health. In accordance with law, students must obtain work permits from school authorities before accepting employment.

Parent-Written Request Required for Issuance of Work Permit

No work permit shall be issued, under this policy, until and unless the student's parent/guardian, foster parent, caregiver or residential shelter services provider has filed asigned the written request for the permit with the district. (Education Code 49110)

District Issuance of Work Permit

The-In determining whether to grant or continue a work permit, the Superintendent or designee shall issue work permits only as allowed by law and only to the extent that outsideconsider whether employment does not is likely to significantly interfere with the student's school work. A student must have student's schoolwork. Students granted work permits must demonstrate and maintain a 2.0 grade point average and satisfactory attendance in order to be granted a work permit, except as permitted herein. A student enrolled in students who do not meet the City of Oakland's Measure Y Intervention Program may be granted a temporary waiver, from the initial requirement to have a 2.0 grade point average and satisfactory attendance, for not more than one calendar year from the date of initial issuance of a-requirement may be granted a provisional work permit.

Eligibility based on grade point average for students in continuation schools shall not be renewable. be determined by the most recent grading period, not the cumulative grade point average.

Students 16 or 17 years of age shall be granted approval to work more than 20 hours a week only when justified by unusual circumstances which shall be stated on the work permit.

On a case-by-case basis, the Superintendent or designee may approve a maximum work hour limit that is lower than the limit specified in law and administrative regulation.

Students with work permits may be exempted from attendance in a full-time day school provided they attend part-time classes. (Education Code 48230)

District Issuance of Work Permit

In determining whether to grant or continue a work permit, the Superintendent or designee shall consider whether employment is likely to significantly interfere with the student's schoolwork. Students granted work permits must demonstrate and maintain a 2.0 grade point average. Students who do not meet the grade point average requirement may be granted a provisional work permit.

Eligibility based on grade point average for students in continuation schools shall be determined by the most recent grading period, not the cumulative grade point average.

On a case-by-case basis, the Superintendent or designee may approve a maximum work hour limit that is lower than the limit specified in law and administrative regulation.

Students with work permits may be exempted from attendance in a full-time day school provided they attend part-time classes. (Education Code 48230)
